On April 26, 2016, *Draken Harald Hårfagre*, the worlds largest Viking ship built in modern times, left her home port in Haugesund, Norway, and sailed off for a challenging voyage across the North Atlantic Ocean, bound for North America. At our April meeting it was brought up that interested parties could possibly go see the sailing ship when she stops at the following nearby ports: *Chicago*, July 27; *Green Bay*, August 5; *Duluth*, August 18, 2016. Several Norwegian American organizations are planning trips to see the ship. Are you interested?

MIDSOMMER CELEBRATION

With the demise of Little Norway comes the need to celebrate the Nordic festival of midsummer at a different location. This year I am offering my family's lake as a venue for this festive celebration. The 16 acre spring-fed lake is stocked with many species of pan and game fish. We do not allow boats, so all fishing must be from the shoreline. I would suggest arriving close to 3 PM in the afternoon and enjoy some time fishing. Little



ones will be especially excited as our bluegills are hungry and quickly bite bait cast into the water. A hat would be helpful to shade yourself from the hotter afternoon sun. Please follow Wisconsin regulations and have your fishing license ready. This lake is a water of the state, and is supervised, on occasion, by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

In addition, the lake is surrounded by woods which are great for hiking and exploring. Bring your cameras to capture pictures of waterfowl and other wildlife that make the area their home. There are berry bushes for picking, and an abundance of plant life. I will lead hikes through the woods for those who are interested. A scavenger hunt will be held for the little ones.



A potluck dinner will be served at 6:30 PM. BYOB, a dish to pass, and your table service. Vennelag will provide lemonade and have coffee available. Folding chairs and tables are encouraged. Blankets will also work! Feel free to bring your portable grill. We are a bring-in, take-out property. All refuse must leave at the end of the night. A depository will be available for any charcoal.

As the sky darkens, a bonfire will be lit. Those so inclined may dance around the fire. Music will be provided on CD, unless someone would like to provide live music. As evening descends, we are often greeted by those who buzz and bite. Please equip your family with the proper mosquito/tick repellant, long-sleeved clothing, or other items that will make the evening enjoyable.



I have also invited members from other Zone 3 Lodges to join us. I look forward to having your families join mine for an evening of simple country enjoyment. The date has been set for Saturday, June 18, with a rain date on Sunday, June 19.

Lastly, the time schedule has changed to 9 AM- 1:30 PM.
