The Secretary and Treasurer's Reports were approved as presented.

OLD BUSINESS:

President Severson thanked Betty Norvold for her work on our "Norske Day Bus Trip to Minneapolis". The President noted that Sandra Olson was elected to represent the International Convention in Minneapolis on August 16-18. In reporting on this, she noted that in order to qualify to serve as an international convention delegate you must own a Sons of Norway policy or investment.

The theme of the Convention was "Sailing for Growth" and encouragement was made to bring new members to join the Sons of Norway. Also the delegates voted on approximately 46 bylaws to their constitution. Ron Stubbings was elected President of the Sons of Norway and Robin Fossum, President of Dovre Lodge in Chetek, was elected a delegate from District 5 to serve on the International Board of Directors. The next International Convention will be in Hamar, Norway, in 2020 and the District 5 Convention will be held in Madison, WI.

NEW BUSINESS:

Sjøland Lodge in Amery has disbanded and invitations have been sent to their members to join our lodge. Nominating Committee: President Severson will be contacting members to get volunteers for this committee. Vice President Jacobson is exploring having a brunch to recruit new members. The date has been scheduled for 10/27/18.

A motion was made and approved to have a committee evaluate the condition of the float we received from the disbanded Sjøland Lodge. It will need some repair before using it on Syttende Mai, 2019. We asked Don Olson and Einar Sandom to serve on this committee to look at and evaluate the cost and time for repairs. Should it need lots of work, we may consider the feasibility of keeping it. We have the float stored at a near-by location at a cost of \$30.00 per month for the next 6 months.

The next meeting is September 24th and the program will be "Our Trip to Spain" with Gary and Randi Hoffman.

A Board/Director's Meeting is scheduled for September 10th at 1:00 PM at Zion. Agenda items include: Nominating Committee, Recruitment Brunch, and programming for 2019. Door prizes were given and the meeting was adjourned at 8:45 PM.

"MEETING UP WITH JIMMY"

Betty Norvold met up with Jimmy Miller, our special young woodcarver member, at the July Nordic Fest in Decorah, Iowa, this summer. She asked him to write about his summer experience in Norway and we are happy to publish it in this issue.

"I had an absolutely amazing time this summer traveling through Eastern Norway meeting with expert instrument builders and those in the folk music community. I was able to visit Oslo and Lillehammer, but I spent most my time in the beautiful countryside of Numedal, Valdres, and a town called Trysil.

In Numedal,(the most peaceful, serene place I have ever seen) I spent time with a man named Sverre Heimdal who is the foremost craftsman of an instrument called the Kravik Lyre. He walked me through all the steps he takes to build this instrument which is a process he has essentially perfected over the years. We also discussed other instruments he has built, including Hardanger fiddles and a flute called a Sjøfløyte.

In Valdres, I became acquainted with a group who continue to preserve and develop the regions rich musical history at the Valdres Folk Museum. This group mainly consists of Oddrun Hegge, her daughter Ingebørg Hegge Bratrud, Knut Oppheimsbakken, Mari Ormberg and Bård Riise Hoel. In this region I focused on learning about building and playing Langeleiks, which this region has put the most effort into keeping alive, but I also connected with builders and players of other instruments as well.

After a few weeks, my travels took me to Trysil for the annual national competition of folk music and dance, Landskappleleiken, where pretty much everyone I had met in the previous weeks assembled in one place with many more of their peers. They were doing so much more than preserving traditions—they embody them and ensure they are as real as they have ever been.

After Landskappleiken, I taught a three-day woodcarving class in a town outside of Oslo called Lørenskog, then traveled

to Gjøvik to learn from Stein Villa and his wife Marit Steinsrud. They are amazing multi-instrumentalists who focus on historical musical instruments and how they evolved through time. I returned to Valdres where I joined another folk music festival, in which I

was able to participate in part of a langeleik-playing class.



In short, I traveled through the valleys of Eastern Norway learning from people who preserve musical traditions that have existed for hundreds of years. I was able to develop lasting connections that prompt many future trips to come thanks to the generosity and kindness of the people who welcomed me to their towns, homes, fjords, forests and mountains. I remain in daily contact with some wonderful friends I made and I eagerly look forward to my next Norwegian adventure."
