If you wish to continue celebrating the holiday, you can attend the Mindekirken Syttende Mai Church Service and Program on Sunday, the 19th at the Norwegian Lutheran Memorial Church in Minneapolis, just off Franklin Avenue. Services begin at 11AM, with a parade at noon and lunch at 1:00 PM followed by the program.

In June, our Lodge Meeting will feature Don Nelson, who will speak about the 99th U.S. Norwegian Regiment which was formed for special assignments during WWII.

Parades will be organized and draw thousands of participants; copious amounts of ice cream will be consumed and bunads will abound in a swirl of color and activity.


Children figure prominently in the events, especially in leading the parades. Initially, dating back to 1869, only boys were allowed to march. The girls' participation was not far behind—within 20 years the, too, enjoyed waving their flags as the parades wove through the streets of Norway and beyond.

Grilled sausage, Wienerpølster (weiner sausage) and regular hot dogs are so popular on May 17th that retail grocers have reported a huge bump in sales on the holiday. "Eat what you like" is the mantra for the day and indulging in that manner is a big part of the celebrations.

OLD MUSEKGO CHURCH, WIND LAKE, WIS.



At Old Musekgo on Saturday, June 15 from 11 AM - 3 PM, you can explore many aspects of early Norwegian-American heritage at Heg Park in Wind Lake, Wisconsin. "Old Muskego" was the third Norwegian-American settlement in Wisconsin. It was an important stop for immigrants, where thousands stayed before moving on to farmland further west.

This land was originally owned by settlement leader Evan Heg. His son, Colonel Hans Heg was the highest ranking Norwegian-American killed in the Civil War. With help from the Heg family, this land was purchased by local Sons of Norway members about a century ago. It became Racine County's first county park.


Norwegian Prince Olav V and Princess Martha visited here to celebrate the 100th anniversary of this community. The museum, log cabin, barn (with farm tool display) and Elling Eielson parsonage will be open for tours. Heirlooms of early Norwegian-American settler families are in museum displays.

Things to do include book readings by local book authors Sandy Brehl and Mike Palecek who have written on Norwegian topics, a presentation on the 15th Wisconsin Civil War Regiment by Stephen Sherry and a cemetery tour. Zone 4 will also have a zone meeting as part of this event. More information to follow in the upcoming weeks in the *District 5 First Friday News*.

Heritage Members Turning 16

Previously, Heritage members who turned 16 would receive one of four cards instructing them how to transition to the next membership category, Unge Venner. As a part of the simplified dues structure approved at the 2016 International Convention, this membership category for members age 16 to 23 was discontinued in the United States on January 1, 2018, and will be discontinued in Canada and Norway on January 1, 2020.

Unge Venner in the U.S., who are in a household with a member, are automatically transferred into a family membership. Those who are not part of a family membership will receive a dues statement that includes an explanation of the benefits of adult membership in Sons of Norway. (This will take place for Canadian and Norwegian members who turn 16 beginning on January 1, 2020.)
