Moorhead Stave Church

4 p.m. Sunday, March 12 Trinity Lutheran Church

Please join us at 4 p.m. on Sunday at Trinity Lutheran Church for our monthly Lodge meeting. The cultural program for this meeting is a 30-minute documentary on the Moorhead Stave Church.

The Moorhead Stave Church, located in Moorhead, Minnesota, is a full-scale replica of the Hopperstad Stavkirke in Vik, Norway. Constructed in 1998, the Moorhead Stave Church is located next to the museum that exhibits the Hjemkomst Viking Ship.

The Moorhead Stave Church is the product of Guy Paulson, an excellent woodcarver, who, when retiring in 1996 as a research scientist from North Dakota State University in Fargo, wanted to leave a monument in his community honoring the Norwegian and religious roots of his parents. Guy was assisted by many individuals in the construction of the Stave Church, but, without doubt, it was Guy's leadership which made his dream a reality.

All events, cultural program, business meeting, and meal, will be in the lower level of Trinity Lutheran Church, 504 South Westnedge Avenue, downtown Kalamazoo.

Fra Presidenten

The Viking Era, roughly the 300 years between AD 800 to 1100, continues to be a popular topic in national publications.

The current issues (March, 2017) of *Smithsonian* and *National Geographic* both contain major articles on the Vikings.

The *Smithsonian* article, written by Tim Folger, attempts to explain why and how the Viking (or the descendants of the Vikings) left Greenland around 1400, after living there for 400 years. During this period, there were between 2,500 - 5,000 Norwegians living in Greenland.

Why. According to the author, the Norwegians left Greenland because of climate change (colder), change in the ivory market (preference for African elephant ivory over the walrus ivory from Greenland), and the Black Death, which killed 50% of Norway's population.

How. The author draws no convincing conclusions. There are written records, documenting the migration of a few Norwegians. But for the great majority, there is just speculation. Did they perish in the seas? Did they die in Greenland? Or did they migrate successfully back to Norway, leaving no record?

In *National Geographic*, the author writes about the adventurist mindset of the Viking. By using the most advanced technology and science in its day, the Viking developed a ship, which was capable of traveling thousands of miles on the high seas, encountering 50 different cultures over what is today 37 different nation-states.

The Viking explorations had a good side and a bad side. The good side was the trade and settlements that the Vikings accomplished. On the bad side, the Vikings slaughtered innocent people, destroyed property and settlements, and enslaved people.

Both articles, which have excellent photographs, are a mustread for any student of the Vikings.

District 5 scholarships - Applications are due by March 15. There are several scholarships available and information can be found by visiting

Note that all the District 5 scholarships - other than those related to the Masse Moro heritage camp - require a benefits member. S/N products which qualify for benefits include Nordic Elite, Term product, Viking 23 and annuities with a \$2,000 minimum.

The Sons of Norway Foundation - offers college scholarships starting at \$1,000 for current members, children or grandchildren of current members and some are available to non-members as well. Application deadlines changed this year, but there is still one Sons of Norway Foundation post-high school scholarships with a future deadline:

Nancy Lorraine Jensen Memorial Scholarship - open to women only wishing to pursue a degree in physics, chemistry, or engineering: mechanical, electrical, or mechanical. Applicants must be between the ages of 17-35, and other prerequisites apply. Awards vary. DEADLINE: April 1, 2017.
