A Slightly Different Town

On the Svalbard Islands of Norway lies the northernmost town in the world.

Longyearbyen is a former coal mining town, but has since transformed into a cultural and commercial center. What makes Longyearbyen so unique isn't just its location, but the few strange laws that the residents must abide by.

The most bizarre law might be that it is illegal for the dead to be buried in Longyearbyen due to the sub-zero temperatures. If a death does occur, the body is taken to the mainland. A woman also cannot give birth in the town; an expectant mother must go to the mainland to deliver her child.

Cats are banned from the city in order to protect Arctic

birds. Residents are required to carry a firearm when traveling outside of the settlement, but it is illegal to have a loaded firearm within the town. It is also customary to remove one's shoes when entering an establishment, even in the museum and church

Directions to Cadwallader Park from I-94

Exit I•94 at Exit 85 (Galesburg-Augusta). Turn toward Galesburg-Augusta.

Travel north on 35th St 1 mile.

Turn left on M•96/E Michigan Ave and follow .8 mile. Turn right at N 33rd St for 3.1 miles.

Continue on N 32nd St for 5.5 miles.

N 32nd St turns right and becomes M•43/Wall Lake Rd. Follow 3.3 miles.

Turn right (east) onto Hickory Road.

Cadwallader Park is 2.1 miles on the left. (If you get to Hickory Corners, you've gone too far.)

Directions to Cadwallader Park from inside Kalamazoo (Gull Road & Sprinkle intersection)

Follow Gull Road/M-43 northeast for 5.1 miles to traffic light in Richland.

Turn left (north) on M-43/M-89 and follow 5.7 miles. Turn right (east) onto Hickory Road.

Cadwallader Park is 2.1 miles on the left. (It's before Hickory Corners)

Directions to Cadwallader Park from US -131 North of Kalamazoo (or M-89)

Exit US -131 at Exit 49A - Plainwell.
Follow M-89 east 12 miles to stop sign at M-43.
Turn left (north) on M-43 and continue for 5 miles.
Turn right (east) onto Hickory Road.
Cadwallader Park is 2.1 miles on the left. (It's before Hickory Corners)


Alice talked about her activities with the Children of the American Revolution, a youth group which she leads as the state president. James reported on his activities with the Greater Kalamazoo Skating Association.
