Curt Osborn, Sports & Recreation Director In celebration of the 125th anniversary of the founding of Sons of Norway, District 5 has issued a sports/physical challenge to all lodges. It also supports our youth heritage camp, Masse Moro. Lodge members are encouraged to keep track of the miles walked, ran, swam, cycled, skied, or accumulated through other activities using a pedometer, Fit Bit or similar device. All ages can participate, including Heritage members. Heritage (youth) members may wear pedometers during their practices, games, and tournaments to collect additional miles for our lodge.

The Challenge began November 1, 2019, and goes through June 15, 2020. The challenge's objective is to track an individual's miles from various sporting activities and obtain the Lodge's aggregate total. The goal is to match the virtual distance from Askeladden Lodge to Minneapolis, MN (where Sons of Norway was founded, 604 miles) and then to Ringsaker, Norway where this year's International Lodge Meeting and Convention will be held (3,984 miles) for a combined Lodge effort of 4,588 miles.

As Sportsdirektøren, I will track Askeladden Lodge's progress and submit our member's efforts to District 5's Sports & Recreation Director. Please mail or email me with the following: Participant's Name, Activity Type, and Miles attained. You can also vie for your sports medal as well. Participants may choose to find sponsors who will donate an amount per mile for their efforts, or we may opt to give a donation on behalf of our athletes. Monies will be deposited into the District 5 Nordic Legacy Foundation, with the intent of providing funding to Masse Moro. A suggested minimum contribution of \$50.00 per lodge is encouraged.

Lodge sports directors are encouraged to receive a monthly report from their participants that can be shared with their lodge members at a meeting or by newsletter, telling how many miles have been recorded.

Lodges who complete the challenge will be recognized in the following ways:

- Lodge names and locations will be posted on the District 5 webpage.
- Lodges will receive a certificate suitable for framing in recognition of member efforts.
- Pictures of some active participants will be shared at the District 5 Convention in Madison, WI.

Proposed Bylaw changes for our lodge

The Askeladden Board of Directors recently became aware that at the last International Convention, the Sons of Norway voted to change the default makeup of the Local Lodge Board of Directors to include only four officers: President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. Unless we specify differently in our local lodge bylaws, these four position holders make up our entire board.

Previously our Board consisted of the six positions: President, Vice President, Secretary, Membership Secretary, Treasurer, and Cultural Director or Social Director.

On January 25, the current Board of Directors met to discuss and draft bylaw amendments that would remedy the situation and officially restore the positions we previously had in our Board Makeup.

The proposed amendment reads as follows:

In accordance with Article 4.11.2 of the Sons of Norway Constitution, the elected officers of the lodge shall be President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Cultural Director and Membership Secretary.

In addition, the Board discussed and approved an additional bylaw change regarding our election process. Instead of holding elections annually, we will go to the model of elections every other year, thus position holders will hold office for two years, providing some continuity to our lodge leadership.

The proposed election amendment reads as follows:

In accordance with Article 4.11.6 of the Sons of Norway Constitution, the officers shall be elected for a term of two (2) years.

These proposed changes will be distributed and read aloud at the business portion of our February meeting. We will vote on them at a subsequent meeting. Passage requires two thirds vote from all members present at the meeting where the vote is held. Even then, the new bylaws will not take effect until they are approved by the main office and Counsel of Sons of Norway. So in the meantime, we are operating with a four-person Board of Directors. The corrected version of the 2020 Askeladden Officers is presented here.
