Whether your family has maintained connections with your Norwegian family, or whether you've just discovered *Alt for Norge* (the genealogy fueled Norwegian hit reality show), chances are you've wondered if there isn't something more out there for you to discover about your ancestry.

Maybe you've even subscribed to one of the genealogy websites, such as Ancestry or Family Tree. Such sites can be a storehouse of information, if you are very careful that you are connecting the right dots. But Scandinavian genealogy is full of quirks and twists that can make tracing your lineage a very challenging quest. And, when you add the extra layers of immigration and Americanization to the puzzle, it can become that much more challenging.

On January 14, we'll have the chance to learn directly from Dana Kelly, the Executive Director of the Norwegian American Genealogical Center and Naeseth Library (https://www.nagcnl.org/) in Madison, Wisconsin. Dana will tell us about the Center's resources (including genealogists-for-hire!) and share wisdom gathered over more than 20 years of experience assisting Norwegian Americans in digging for their Scandinavian roots.

### **Annual Lutefisk Luncheon**

Last month, December 2<sup>nd</sup>, I attended the annual lutefisk lunch of the Nordic Fellows, an association of Scandinavian men in the Detroit area. The lunch was at The Swedish Club in Farmington Hills. This was the third year that I have attended this event.

At the first luncheon which I attended, 10 years ago, about 100 people attended, most of whom were of retirement age. The late Gene Steensma was the master of ceremonies.

This year, about 50 people attended. Among the attendees were several young men (under age 40) from Norway, who work in the Detroit area, providing youthful optimism. Dennis Flessland was the master of ceremonies.

The meal consisted of lutefisk, Swedish meatballs, potatoes, peas, carrots, beets, hardtack, limpa, coffee, and aquavit. The lutefisk was supplied by Olsen Fish Company of Minneapolis. With the exception of the aquavit, you could eat as much as you wanted.

After the luncheon, I visited Ikea, the Swedish retail store in Canton, 10 miles South of The Swedish Club.

### **Norwegian Resolutions for 2024**

The New Year is traditionally a time when many of us establish goals to make improvements in our lives. I believe physical, mental and spiritual health are interdependent and the Norwegian concept of *friluftsliv* encompasses those connections. Norwegian playwright Henrik Ibsen coined the term in the 1850's as a way to explain the benefits of spending time outdoors for spiritual and physical well-being.

The following except from a September 12<sup>th</sup>, 2020, *National Geographic* article describes the Norwegian value of *friluftsliv* or outdoor living.

### A way of life

"Friluftsliv is more than just an activity, it's a kind of lifestyle," says Lasse Heimdal, secretary general of <u>Norsk</u> <u>Friluftsliv</u>, an organization representing 5,000 outdoors groups in Norway. "It's very tied to our culture and what it means to be a Norwegian."

Norwegian playwright Henrik Ibsen is generally credited with inventing the term in the 1859 poem "On the Heights," which recounts a farmer's yearlong trek through the wilderness. By the end of the poem, the protagonist ditches civilization for good.

But Heimdal says friluftsliv isn't just for hard-core athletes and intrepid explorers. Friluftsliv can also mean long strolls with friends, picnics, a leisurely afternoon bike ride, or walking the dog on a chilly morning. There's even a special word, utepils, for drinking a beer outdoors.

"Most people think it's healthy, it's social," Heimdal says. "You get kind of a time-out from cell phones and computers ... being outdoors and in nature, it's one of the best places to relax." What is 'friluftsliv'? How an idea of outdoor living could help us this winter | National Geographic

While it's fairly easy to set goals, actual behavior change is more challenging. It may be helpful to write a description of what the aimed for behavior looks like with specific times and locations identified. For example, if I want to increase my time outside enjoying the benefits of exercise and fresh air, I might commit to taking a 30-minute walk around the local fields and orchard on 3 mornings every week after my grandkids have left for pre-school. I will keep track of my accomplishments by putting a green "happy face" sticker on my weekly pocket calendar on the days I do my nature walks. For accountability, I'll share my *friluftsliv* behaviors with my family and with Askeladden friends at our next meeting.

I encourage each of you to ponder ways you might incorporate more *friluftsliv* into your daily life. Here's to a healthier and more robustly Norwegian 2024!

### **Combatting the Long Winter**

As winter approaches and the days get darker, it is common for moods to do the same. In fact, many people suffer from seasonal affective disorder during this time of year. With this knowledge, how can we be proactive in combating the effects of a long winter? Perhaps we take notes from residents in Tromsø, Norway. During the winter months in Tromsø, there are only two to three hours of indirect sunlight, however its inhabitants don't seem to be as affected by seasonal sadness as one might think.

A study done at the University of Tromsø found that sleep was slightly disturbed but there was "no increase in mental distress during the winter." Health psychologist, Kari Leibowitz, concluded that one's mindset was the vital factor in determining how they would be affected by the winter. A positive mindset toward stressful events, such as a dark wintertime, not only enhanced moods but also influenced physiological responses. Amazingly enough, she also found that attitudes increased with latitude showing that positive thoughts were present where they were most needed.


