# Norway: Folk-Art, Fjords and Rural Life

Join us Sunday when Gail Thompson-Hadley will share photos and adventures

from her August 2023 12-day trip to Norway with Norwegian-American wood carvers, Else Bigton and Phillip Odden, on their folk-art, fjords, and rural life tour. Gail will show us the breath-taking scenery from winding mountain roads with views of the fjords, interiors of ancient stave churches, as well as renown Norwegian wood-worker craftsmen in their workshops, traditional meals served on family farms, and videos of roaring waterfalls, a Hardanger fiddler, and awesome Norwegian Fjord horses performing at the national training center.

Gail shared some of her Norwegian explorations of the replica Myklebust Viking ship in the September 2023 Askeladden newsletter and she told us about the Lom Stave Church, spectacular waterfalls, and the King's Hall in Bergen built 950 years ago in our October 2023 newsletter. ### **Hooley for Healing 2024**

The Hooley for Healing happens March 16, at <u>Rugger's Up & Under</u> after the St. Patrick's Day Parade. The local cancer benefit began in 2012, by Erin Quinn, owner of <u>Quinn School of Irish Dance</u>, and Eileen Chlebana, then owner of <u>Celtic Seasons</u>. Both have lost family members to cancer and they founded the event to help other families coping with the disease while celebrating St. Patrick's Day with an authentic Irish party, known as a "hooley."

Donations will be accepted at the door, and numerous items will be available as part of this year's auction. Curt Tramel and Simone Keenan Irish, who many likely know from Fonn Mór, will perform. The Quinn School of Irish Dance will also be performing, and there will be fun games and contests throughout the afternoon.

Over \$54,000 has been raised and distributed since 2012 to families that are coping with cancer. I attended last year's Hooley which raised over \$14,000 for two recipients. There are two new beneficiaries this year – Sara Dawson and Betsy Valentine.

The Silent Auction and food sales will be on one side of the building, with musical acts and Irish dancers on the other side. I urge you to come on down after the parade and be Irish for a day!

Most of us are familiar with Rick Steves who has been guiding travel around the world for fifty years. He also happens to be descended from Norwegian immigrants. I just learned that his advised travel souvenir is not an item you can buy at a local shop but rather he suggests we create a journal of our travel thoughts and reactions. As I spend the time before our March 10<sup>th</sup> meeting preparing a slide show of my photos from my August 2023 Norway trip for our Askeladden program, I am fortunate to have written a daily travel journal myself. Every night after a dozen days packed with

adventures exploring rural Norway and learning about her arts and culture, I spent an hour selecting the best of my photos for the day and then sharing them with my family via my cell phone text messages. For each group of photos, I wrote a description of the wondrous waterfalls, mountain views, astounding wood-carving craftsmen, awesome ancient stave churches, music, Fjord horses, tasty food, and so much more.



We've been blessed this year by learning about the

Norwegian trips shared by lodge members, Kris Spence and Karn Erlandson, last November and by David and Terese Sherman and family in February. I did not have Norwegian relatives to visit during my trip like they did, but I look forward to sharing some of the outstanding art, culture, and rural life I learned about from wood carvers and furniture craftsmen, Phil and Else, who led our tour.

Else, a native-born Norwegian, met Phil from rural western Wisconsin when they were studying wood-carving at the school in Dovre, Norway back in the 1970's. After their marriage, they established wood-carving and furniture building workshops and a business in Wisconsin along with raising Norwegian Fjord horses. Else and Phil have gone back to Norway every year to continue to learn their crafts and study with Norwegian folk artists. For the past 14 years, they have led rural folk-art tours in Norway which include visits with and presentations by their long-time folk-artist friends.
