Recap of the November Lodge Meeting

At the November Lodge meeting, we had a large turnout, no doubt so members could attend the Remembrance Service for Roger Drong who died unexpectedly.

The meeting started with the cultural program, a 45-minute lecture by Dave Nordin, a Trustee of the Friends of the Viking Ship (FOVS) of the greater Chicago area. Mr. Nordin spoke about a Viking ship called the "Viking."

After the cultural program, members enjoyed a lunch featuring several cheeses, fruits, crackers, and cookies.

The Remembrance Service for Roger Drong, arranged by Holly Jensen, lasted 30 minutes. About ten persons spoke about their relationships with Roger. Interestingly, many of persons who spoke talked about how Roger helped them with their genealogy. At the end of the Remembrance Service, Roger's sister and nephew from Minnesota spoke to the group. Both said Roger cared much about his family.

At the business session, led by Lodge President Curt Osborn, the lodge elected the 2020 officers and directors and approved the 2020 budget.

The 2020 Board of Directors will consist of Gail Hadley as president, Joan O'Bryan as vice president, Judy Hande-Skutnick as membership secretary, Curtis Cleveland as treasurer, and Holly Jensen as cultural director. The position of secretary remains vacant. The complete list of the 2020 officers and directors will be printed in the January 2020 issue of the newsletter.

After discussion, the lodge voted to attend the Vasa Sankta Lucia Festival on Saturday, December 14, for the December lodge meeting instead of the planned meeting on the second Sunday.

After the Lodge meeting, the Board of Directors met. The board passed no motions.

Roger Francis Drong April 22, 1939 - October 31, 2019

Roger F. Drong, 80, passed away in Kalamazoo on October 31 from an apparent heart attack, while recovering from pneumonia.

Born on April 22, 1939, in Hibbing, Minnesota, he was the son of the late Frank P. and Edith Cecile (*Rosenquist*) Drong. Roger is survived by his sister and brother-in-law Shirley and Orvin Melaas, of Lindström, Minnesota and four nieces and nephews.

Roger was an active and key member of Askeladden Lodge since 2005, serving in various positions, but always on the Cultural Committee, which he chaired several years. Roger was a devoted and spirited member of the local Vasa Swedish-American lodge since 1995. He acted as a de facto liaison between Vasa and Sons of Norway year after year, bringing us details of the Swedish Midsommarfest and coordinating our participation in the Fish Boil. Each summer, he enjoyed the joint Vasa/Sons of Norway Ice Cream Socials. Roger was a friend to many in both local groups. In addition, he was a long-time member of the Finnish-American Society of West Central Michigan in Coopersville (an affiliate of Finlandia Foundation National) and he also belonged to a private local Scandinavian Club.

Roger was our "Scandinavian Genealogy" expert. No lesser description would be accurate. He led multiple workshops for our lodge over the years. Once, we nearly missed the opportunity of his tutelage when we arrived at the Portage Senior Center, only to find it locked up tight. The near-disaster was averted when we were able to shift the workshop to an open classroom at the Portage Public Library next door. Over the years, Roger generously used his expert knowledge to assist individual members of the lodge in tracking their personal family history.

Roger was an extremely reliable team member. He always showed up early and never missed a meeting unless he was out of town on a genealogy/cultural trip or volunteering for his passion, The Gilmore Keyboard Festival. In addition to volunteering, Roger donated to the Gilmore for more than 20 years. Roger was routinely the first person on site after we moved our meetings to Trinity Lutheran Church. As our Lodge Librarian, he would move over 200 Nordic books out on display before every event and then collect and put them all away afterward.

Roger was known for providing his "spiked" glögg at Vasa holidays — or gløgg, as it's known at Norwegian holidays. He was also our expert Æbleskiver maker. He was a master of all things Nordic, be it Finnish, Swedish, Danish or Norwegian, especially if the topic involved any form of

art. The cultural programs he researched and presented were always fascinating.

There was a heart-felt Remembrance for Roger at the Viking Ship Restoration Program on November 10 at Trinity Lutheran Church. There were so many testimonials from all the people whose lives Roger had touched, that the ceremony went on for quite a while. Roger's sister and nephew were here from Minnesota to witness all the heart-felt stories about her older brother, many of which came from people grateful for Roger's help with their journeys into tracking their genealogy. The various groups that Roger regularly

participated in were well-represented with members who came to the November program just for Roger's memorial ceremony. The Fellowship Hall was filled with about 75 people in attendance.

Roger earned a BS in Chemistry from Michigan Technological University, Houghton, MI in 1961. He later earned an M.S. in Biochemistry, at the University of Minnesota, in St. Paul, MN in 1976. Roger joined the Upjohn Company in September 1963 and again in 1995. He retired from the Pfizer Corp. in 2005 as a Research Biochemist (Level III) in Central Nervous System Genomics Research.

Askeladden Lodge is making a donation to the District 5 Masse Moro Norwegian Heritage Camp in Roger's memory.

It goes without saying that Roger is missed by so many. We have a huge hole in our hearts, remembering this gentle soul.
