In last month's column, when writing about Christmas, I mentioned the importance of the traditions that we follow from year to year, such as the Christmas decorations and the Christmas Day dinner.

This month, I'm writing again about traditions, this time as they relate to the Lodge meetings, such as the day of the month on which they are held and the starting time of the Lodge meetings.

Traditionally, since 1999, our lodge meetings have been held on the second Sunday of the month, starting at 4 p.m.

January meeting recap

At the January Lodge meeting, we watched a DVD on the "Hjemkomst Viking Ship." This ship, modeled after the famous Gokstad Viking Ship in the Viking Ship Hall in Oslo, was built by Robert Asp, a school teacher from Moorhead, Minnesota, in the decade of the 1970s. The ship sailed from Duluth, Minnesota to Bergen and Oslo in 1982. Today, the ship is permanently on display in Moorhead, Minnesota.

The 2017 Lodge Officers were Installed, with Dennis Darling performing the duties of the Installing Officer.

During the Business Meeting, after a one-hour discussion, the Lodge adopted a new policy statement on the Norway Trip Drawing.

There were nine members and eight guests at this meeting. Most of the guests were members of VASA, who were meeting separately in the building, joining us for the program on the "Hjemkomst Viking Ship."

2017 Scholarship Information

Cultural Skill Scholarship applications are available to members in the form of a grant, not to exceed \$250. The grants may be given to attend workshops, seminars, conferences or other events promoting Norwegian Culture. The Cultural Grant program does not have a due date. The application guidelines are also on our website.

District 5 scholarships - Applications are due by March 15. There are several scholarships available and information can be found by visiting

Note that all the District 5 scholarships - other than those related to the Masse Moro heritage camp - require a benefits member. S/N products which qualify for benefits include Nordic Elite, Term product, Viking 23 and annuities with a \$2,000 minimum.

The Sons of Norway Foundation - offers college scholarships starting at \$1,000 for current members, children or grandchildren of current members and some are available to non-members as well. Application deadlines changed this year, but there are still two Sons of Norway Foundation post-high school scholarships with future deadlines:

- Astrid G. Cates/Myrtle Beinhauer Fund-Award: \$1,000.00 college study in any discipline at a U.S. college or university, Awards vary. DEADLINE: March 1, 2017
- Nancy Lorraine Jensen Memorial Scholarship open to women only wishing to pursue a degree in physics, chemistry, or engineering: mechanical, electrical, or mechanical.
 Applicants must be between the ages of 17-35, and other prerequisites apply. Awards vary. DEADLINE: April 1, 2017.

Remembering Raymond P. Knutson

Long-time leader of the Sons of Norway, Ray Knutson died on January 20 at age 80.

Ray attended our Lodge meeting in December 2013, presenting us with a plaque from the International Sons of

Norway, commemorating the 25th Anniversary of Askeladden Lodge.

At that meeting, I remember one incident very vividly. Ray, during his "Remarks for the Good of the Order," complained that the local lodges were not submitting photographs to the District to be published in the *Viking* magazine. Our Publicity Committee members, Joan, Karin, and Holly, let it be known that was not the case.

At the District 5 Convention in June 2016, I had the opportunity to talk with Ray again. Ray was the quintessential Sons of Norway member. His dedication to the organization, as well as the devotion of others, is the reason we can have a Sons of Norway.

Ray, who was a past President of District 5, made his living as a plumber. His parents were of Norwegian and Lithuanian background.

A Romantic Restoration

A current restoration project taking place at Maihaugen, one of Northern Europe's largest open-air museums in Lillehammer, Norway, is generating anticipation for the project's completion.

The endeavor is steeped in Norwegian culture, a bit of romance and a royal twist.

Just weeks ago, the disassembled 1930s childhood home of H.M. Queen Sonja of Norway was moved from its original location at Tuengen allé 1b at Vinderen, Oslo, to Maihaugen in Lillehammer. The home is to be reassembled, furnished in an authentic manner, and opened to the public as part of a popular attraction at the museum that features homes representing each decade from the 1920s through 2001.

Work is now underway to breathe life into the house, which will showcase replicated and original furnishings used

from 1935 to 1968. Queen Sonja lived there for most of her childhood years, until 1968 when she married then Crown Prince Harald. According to Maihaugen's website, the home was one of the few

places the couple could meet during the nine years they were dating.

The house is constructed in the functionalist style, with hipped roof, horizontal cladding, windows by the corners and balconies with steel rails.

Museum guests can look forward to the official opening of the project on August 29, 2018, the date of Their Majesties' 50th wedding anniversary.
