Robert Asp and the Hjemkomst Viking Ship 4 p.m. Sunday, January 8 **Trinity Lutheran Church**

Please join us on Sunday, January 8, at Trinity Lutheran Church to enjoy the inspiring story of Robert Asp and the Hjemkomst Viking Ship.

Robert Asp was a school teacher in Moorhead, Minnesota, who dreamed of building a Viking ship and sailing on it to Norway. Asp conceived the idea of building the ship in 1971. He laid the keel in 1974. Asp's ship, the Hjemkomst, sailed from Duluth to Bergen in 1982.

We all have traditions that we follow from year to year at Christmas. For me, visiting New York City has been my Christmas tradition for several years.

On my trip this year, every day I would encounter people or places which reminded me of Norway or Scandinavia.

One day, when walking through Grand Central Station, I found a new food court, called "New York Nordic Food." The owner of this new food venue is from Denmark. One of the specialties at the Nordic Food Hall is the open rye, or openfaced sandwich, called the "Smorrebred," costing about \$10.

A few blocks south of Grand Central Station, is the Scandinavian House on Park Avenue. Although they didn't have an art exhibit going on this year, I did look at the items, many of them made in Scandinavian countries, in the gift shop.

On Christmas Day, I stopped at the Norwegian Seamen's Church on East 52nd Street. After looking at an excellent exhibit of paintings by the Norwegian artist Heidi Fosli in the Trygve Lie Gallery, I was invited to join the Church members for coffee and treats, which was very enjoyable.

On my last day in NYC, I walked around Battery Park, which is located at the southern tip of Manhattan, to see the Norwegian Monument. The Norwegian Monument, consisting of two boulders, dedicated in 1982, although very small by NYC standards and therefore difficult to find, is a gift from the Norwegian WWII Veterans to the people of America to show appreciation for America's help during the war.

New York City is known as a cosmopolitan and diverse city. A small part of that diversity is Norwegian culture. One hundred years ago, Norwegians were concentrated in the Bay Ridge area of Brooklyn. Today, they are spread all over the Greater New York Area.

2017 Scholarship Information

One of the important benefits of Sons of Norway membership is eligibility to apply for scholarships at three levels: Lodge, District, and National Foundation.

Lodge Scholarships - Applications for the 2017 Askeladden Myrtle Beinhauer Scholarships are due to Joyce Hare by March 15, 2017, and must be turned into her by that date. The application forms and all related information are available online at www.norwayinkalamazoo.com Joyce's address is: 6909 Towhee, Portage, MI 49024. Cultural Skill Scholarship applications are available to members in the form of a grant, not to exceed \$250. The grants may be given to attend workshops, seminars, conferences or other events promoting Norwegian Culture. There is not a due date for the Cultural Grant program. The application guidelines are also on our website.

District 5 scholarships - Applications are due by March 15. There are several scholarships available and information can be found by visiting **sonsofnorway5.com/financial/ scholarships.php** Note that all the District 5 scholarships - other than those related to the Masse Moro heritage camp - require a henefits

than those related to the Masse Moro heritage camp - require a benefits member. S/N products which qualify for benefits include Nordic Elite, Term product, Viking 23 and annuities with a \$2,000 minimum.

The Sons of Norway Foundation - offers college scholarships starting at \$1,000 for current members, children or grandchildren of current members and some are available to non-members as well. Application deadlines changed this year, but there are still two Sons of Norway Foundation post-high school scholarships with future deadlines:

- Astrid G. Cates/Myrtle Beinhauer Fund-Award: \$1,000.00 college study in any discipline at a U.S. college or university, Awards vary. DEADLINE: March 1, 2017
- Nancy Lorraine Jensen Memorial Scholarship open to women only wishing to pursue a degree in physics, chemistry, or engineering: mechanical, electrical, or mechanical. Applicants must be between the ages of 17-35, and other prerequisites apply. Awards vary. DEADLINE: April 1, 2017.

NOTE: The deadlines for the other five Foundation scholarships have been extended to January 9, 2017. Unlike the District 5 scholarships, the Foundation grants and scholarships do not seem to require a benefits member, but like District 5, most of them do require the sponsoring family member to be a Sons of Norway member for at least a year.
