# Midsommarfest with VASA at Cadwallader Park Saturday, June 24, Noon

Keeping with years of tradition, our lodge is invited to join in the fun at the VASA Midsommarfest at Cadwallader Park in Hickory Corners. The activities start at noon and the smörgåsbord meal begins at 1 p.m.

Water and ice will be provided. Bring a dish to pass of any type of food – Scandinavian preferred, but something that will withstand the weather.

Cadwallader Park has a covered pavilion with picnic tables and a small playground for the children. Planned activities including singing and dancing around the Midsommarstang (Maypole) and a round of the Viking game of Kubb. To get to Cadwallader Park, head for the Gilmore Car Museum, which is almost six miles north of Richland at the intersection of M-43/M-89 and Hickory Road. Turn right onto Hickory Road, drive 2.1 miles, going east, and look for the Swedish flag on the north (left) side of the road.

You probably won't find Cadwallader Park on any map or GPS. So bring this newsletter with you if you haven't been to this event before. Complete directions from several locations can be found on page 2.

My earliest thoughts are those of the Memorial Day parades in the small town that in grew up in west-central Minnesota, Detroit Lakes. The parades began with two or three sedan cars with large gold stars on the doors of the cars. The crowd watched in silence and reverence as the Gold Star Mothers rode by in these cars.

Many years later, I was overwhelmed when I saw the Vietnam War Memorial Wall in Washington, DC.

Because the Wall is below the ground level, you do not see it until you are about 100 feet from it and then, all of a sudden, you are overwhelmed with these two giant triangular walls, made of black granite, containing 58,000 names. Each name represents an American Veteran who died in the Vietnam War.

More recently, four years ago, I was very impressed when I saw the World War II Memorial at the Harvard Memorial Church on the Harvard campus in Cambridge, Massachusetts. When sitting in the pews in the sanctuary, I could read the names of the "Harvard Men," all 690 of them, faculty and students,

carved in stone, on the World War II Memorial, which takes up one side of the sanctuary. I was shocked by the large number of students from Harvard who were killed in WWII.

Last week, on the Memorial Day weekend, at the Chicago Public Library, I saw a memorial called "Above and Beyond," consisting of 58,000 Identification Tags, commonly called dog tags. Each tag has the name of an American serviceperson who was killed in Vietnam.

I hope everyone had a meaningful Memorial Day.

#### **Directions to Cadwallader**

#### Directions to Cadwallader Park from I-94

Exit I•94 at Exit 85 (Galesburg-Augusta). Turn toward Galesburg-Augusta.

Travel north on 35th St 1 mile.

Turn left on M•96/E Michigan Ave and follow 0.8 mile.

Turn right at N 33rd St for 3.1 miles.

Continue on N 32<sup>nd</sup> St for 5.5 miles.

N 32<sup>nd</sup> St turns right and becomes M•43/Wall Lake Rd. Follow 3.3 miles.

Turn right (east) onto Hickory Road.

Cadwallader Park is 2.1 miles on the left. (If you get to Hickory Corners, you've gone too far.)

#### Directions to Cadwallader Park from inside Kalamazoo (Gull Road & Sprinkle intersection)

Follow Gull Road/M•43 northeast for 5.1 miles to traffic light in Richland.

Turn left (north) on M•43/M•89 and follow 5.7 miles.

Turn right (east) onto Hickory Road.

Cadwallader Park is 2.1 miles on the left – before Hickory Corners

## Directions to Cadwallader Park from US•131 North of Kalamazoo (or M•89)

Exit US•131 at Exit 49A - Plainwell.

Follow M•89 east 12 miles to stop sign at M•43.

Turn left (north) on M•43 and continue for 5 miles.

Turn right (east) onto Hickory Road.
