## Fra Presidenten

The much-anticipated 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration is this month. This big event will be Tuesday evening, September 18, at the Fetzer Center, WMU.

Over the past 30 years, Askeladden Lodge has had five other big events, including: Institution Day Dinner, 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Banquet, 2005 Norwegian Centennial Syttende Mai Celebration, 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Banquet, and the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration.

The Institution Day Dinner was held September 24, 1988, at the Brown Derby, Sheridan Inn, Kalamazoo. The 22 officials from the District 5 presided over the initiation ceremony. Then the members of Lodge 5-610 got down to business. They elected and installed the officers of the Lodge and they selected "Askeladden" as the name of the new Lodge. Myrtle Beinhauer was elected the first president of the Lodge. Besides the 22 visitors from District 5, 64 members and 18 guests attended this event.

The 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Banquet was held September 25, 1998, at the Bernhard Center, WMU. Lodge president Terry Gilbertson was the master of ceremonies. Margery Selden provided the entertainment, playing piano music of Norwegian composer Christian Sinding (1856-1941).

The 2005 Norwegian Centennial Syttende Mai Celebration was held on May 17, 2005, at the Fetzer Center, WMU. Holly Jensen was the mistress of ceremonies. Helen Loen, wife of Lodge president Orlin, presented ten scholarship awards. The Code family - Karin, David, and Kjartan - provided the entertainment for the 80 people in attendance, playing Norwegian folk music. Kjartan stole the show with his hat trick.

The 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Banquet on September 20, 2008, was at the Bernhard Center, WMU, with 40 people in attendance. The late Fred Sitkins was the master of ceremonies. Dennis Darling was the Lodge president. Margery Selden provided the entertainment, playing music of the Norwegian composer Edvard Grieg.

Our 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration held September 8, 2013, at Zion Lutheran Church, Kalamazoo, had 35 people in attendance. Lodge president Joyce Hare, on behalf of the Lodge, accepted an official State of Michigan Special Tribute from State Representative Aric Nesbitt of the Michigan State Legislature. The Special Tribute praised the accomplishments of Askeladden Lodge on the occasion of the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.
