Holiday Folk Fair International Announces 2020 Plans

The 77th Holiday Folk Fair International, America's premiere multi-cultural festival, will be reimagined for 2020, with the event to be available "wherever you are" Fri., Nov. 20 – Sun., Nov. 22.

This year's Holiday Folk Fair International will not be done as an in-person event due to COVID-19, but will take place online and feature the education, entertainment, artisan and cooking demonstrations, photographic exhibits, and shopping that Fair-goers have come to cherish.

We are still in the planning stages and more information on the 2020 Holiday Folk Fair International will be shared in the weeks ahead on the event's website and Facebook page.

Voss: An Outdoor Sports Hub With History

Nestled in the mountains between Oslo and Bergen is a haven for outdoor sports enthusiasts and history buffs alike: the town of Vossevangen, more commonly known simply as Voss.

This town of roughly 7,000 people hosts an annual Extreme Sports Week, which is one of the largest events of its type in the world. Fittingly, the area also is home to Norway's largest skydiving club, complete with a skydiving simulation windtunnel for those who wish to experience the thrill of freefall without the altitude.

The area also draws more casual visitors of all skill levels to enjoy the area's excellent year-round outdoor offerings: whitewater rafting and kayaking in the spring, hiking in the summer and fall (including a trail along the escape route taken by Sverre Sigurdsson in 1177), and skiing—both cross-country and downhill—in the winter.

Voss also offers a range of attractions for those less athletically inclined, including a 13th century medieval stone church, a preserved farmstead dating back to the 1500s, and a cable car up the mountainside that offers stunning views of the town in the valley.

We discussed and voted to cancel our laying of the wreath on the Leif Erickson statue this year.

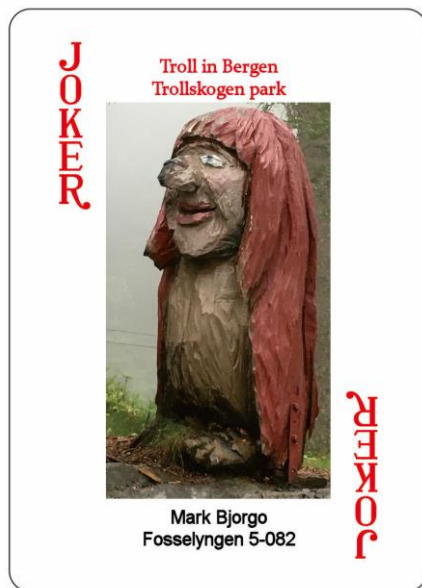
