#### Nov 16 – Norwegians in Logging Camps: Immigrants in the Wisconsin Pineries

The story of logging in the great pineries of northern Wisconsin is familiar to many of us since we were elementary students hearing of Paul Bunyan and Babe the Blue Ox. An old yellowed photo in Glen's possession has led him to learn the role of Norwegians, especially immigrants and their families, in the state's logging action. Hear the stories, old and new, serious and funny, of Norwegian-Americans who worked in winter logging camps near great rivers like the Black and Chippewa.

# Stamp Donations (Reminder to cut out stamps with a small part of the envelope around the stamp and bring to the Christmas Party.)

There are many ways in which we are asked to assist our fellow human beings who are in need. Participation in the Tubfim program is one of the simpler yet successful ways to do just that. Tubfrim is an organization in Norway that resells cancelled stamps and donates the proceeds to help children with disabilities. In 1928 Ditlef Frantzen, postmaster of the small Norwegian town of Nesbyen, got the idea to collect and market canceled stamps as a way of raising funds for the Tuberculosis Association in Norway. Within a few years, his idea caught on and many communities in Norway and beyond were collecting and sending bags of canceled stamps to Nesbyen. When Frantzen left Nesbyen in 1943, he donated his stamp collecting institution to the Norwegian Health Service. Since tuberculosis is no longer the threat to health that it once was, today disabled and needy children receive the proceeds from the resale of stamps. Last year Tubfrim made a profit of 520,000 Kroner (that's almost \$80,000).

To help Tubfrim do is crucial work, simply clip canceled stamps from envelopes, leaving at least a quarter of an inch around the edge. Place your stamps in a plastic bag and bring to the Lodge Christmas Party.

# Rømmegrøt



Sour cream porridge with dried meats was festive food in the olden days and is still considered that today. Sour cream porridge must be made from high fat (35%) natural sour cream, with no stabilizers or gelatin added. For the best results, use homemade sour cream- a recipe is included below.

# Recipe

#### Step 1

To make sour cream, heat 1 cup whipping cream to 95° F/ 35°C, almost body temperature, then whisk in 2 Tbsp. buttermilk. Let stand at room temperature at least 8 hours, until thickened.

#### Step 2

Simmer sour cream, covered, about 15 minutes.

#### Step 3

Sift in  $\frac{1}{3}$  of the flour and stir. Simmer until the butterfat begins to leach out. Skim off the fat and set aside.

#### Step 4

Sift in the remaining flour, stir, and bring porridge to a boil. In a separate pot, bring the milk to a boil. Add milk to the porridge one cup at a time, whisking each time before adding more. Whisk porridge until smooth and simmer about 10 minutes. Season with salt. In a small bowl, mix sugar and cinnamon together. Enjoy the rømmegrøt with melted butterfat and cinnamon sugar sprinkled on top.
