

Old Muskego Settlement Event


Saturday, June 15 (11 AM - 3 PM)



At Old Musekgo on Saturday, June 15 from 11 AM - 3 PM, you can explore many aspects of early Norwegian-American heritage at Heg Park in Wind Lake, Wisconsin. "Old Muskego" was the third Norwegian-American settlement in Wisconsin. It was an important stop for immigrants, where thousands stayed before moving on to farmland further west.



The Heg Park Museum is filled with Norwegian-American artifacts, many of which were heirlooms given by local families. The Col. Hans Heg exhibit (shown here), includes his Civil War dress sword. The Prince and Princess of Norway visited this museum during a world tour. Steve Sherry, a Civil War expert will give a talk on Norwegian's in the Civil War.



Evan and Sigrid Heg were important members of the Old Musego community, and their barn was a shelter for thousands of Norwegian immigrants stopping at Old Muskego on their way to the seek farmland further West. On the cemetery tour, you will learn more about important settlement leaders and also about cholera epidemics which ravaged this colony.



The tool barn has a large collection of 19th century farm and household equipment.

Museum docents will tell you how settlers used these primitive tools to improve their life and build a community. The event will also have lectures and book signings, by Norwegian interest book authors, Sandy Briel and Kathleen Space.





Religion was an important part of the Old Muskego settlement. Rev. Elling Eielson was a traveling minister who professed Haugenism, a "people's religion" and served early Norwegian-American settlements in southern Wisconsin and northern Illinois. Eielson's parsonage, originally in Rock County, was relocated here. A Zone 4 meeting will also be held in conjunction with this event.
