Recipe Conner

I brought these cookies to the March meeting where it received rave reviews and requests for the recipe. So here it is:

ANDES MINT COOKIES

½ c. brown sugar
¼ c. Xylitol (or sugar)
1 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. baking powder
2 tsp. vanilla extract

2 eggs

½ c. butter – softened



1 pkg. Andes Crème de Menthe Baking Chips 2 2/3 c. all-purpose flour

Beat butter, sugars, baking soda, baking powder, vanilla and eggs until mixed. Stir in Andes Baking Chips and then the flour. Chill about one hour in refrigerator. Then roll spoonfuls of dough into approximately 1-inch size balls (*I use a cookie scoop to uniformly measure and form the dough balls in one step.*) Place on a non-stick cookie sheet and slightly flatten the balls. Place in a preheated 350 degree oven on the rack one level above the middle and bake for 9-11 minutes. Cool on pans for two minutes before removing.

Makes 4 dozen cookies

The hardest part about making these cookies is finding the vital ingredient — Andes Crème de Menthe Baking Chips (sold in a 10 oz. bag which resembles a chocolate chips bag—see picture above). However, as a substitute, two boxes of Andes Mint Thins could be used — unwrap all the candies and chop them into little bits (about ¼" to ½" square). The above recipe was adapted from the cookie recipe found on the back of the Andes Crème de Menthe Baking Chips package. — Kathie Injerd
