### **Norwegian Meatball Kebabs**

### For the Meatballs For the Sauce:

<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Lbs Ground beef
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> Cup Dijon Mustard
<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Lbs Ground Pork
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> Cup Brown Sugar
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Cups of Breadcrumbs
<sup>3</sup> Tbsp Cider Vinegar
<sup>1</sup> large egg
<sup>3</sup> Tbsp Vegetable Oil
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup chopped Onion
<sup>2</sup> Tbsp Finely Chopped
Parsley Leaves
Salt to taste
Fresh ground black pepper to taste

#### For the Kebabs

2 Medium Yellow Squash1 Onion2 Yellow Bell Peppers1 Pint Cherry Tomatoes

**Preparation:** Soak the bamboo skewers in water in a large dish for 30 minutes covered with warm water.

To make the meatballs: In a large bowl blend the meatball ingredients until well mixed, do not over mix. Form the mix into  $1 - 1\frac{1}{4}$ " balls and arrange on a tray. This step can be completed up to 1 day ahead, and then stored chilled and covered.

**To make the sauce:** In a large bowl whisk together all of the ingredients for the sauce and mix until the brown sugar dissolves. You can make the sauce up to 1 day in advance, store covered and chilled.

#### Assemble the kebabs:

Halve the squash lengthwise and cut crosswise into good sized 1/2" thick pieces. Quarter onion and cut onion and bell peppers into 1" pieces. Remove the skewers from the water.

After the Christmas season 1904 was over and John was feeling better, he promised Nancy he would follow her example. He caught a freight and headed back to his home in Iowa. For the rest of his life he would say of her, "She taught me what life is all about." Inspired by what Nancy had done for him, John became a medical doctor and touched the lives of many patients for good in the wilds of Idaho. Dr. Weber made many difficult trips to care for the needs of many immigrant families who came to America to homestead. This book is a very moving story which you are sure to enjoy. ### Norway's National Anthem—Do you know it?

Ja, vi elsker, Norway's national anthem, is 151 years old.

The lyrics were written by Bjornstjerne Bjornson, and the melody was written by his cousin Rikard Nordraak.

The text is a modernized version commonly used today, but not identical to Bjornson's original.

In each if the 8 verse's the last two lines are sung twice. Usually only the first and last two verses are sung.
