SECRETARY'S REPORT

Valkyrien Lodge 5—053, Woodville, WI. Meeting Minutes for Oct. 24th, 201

President Olson called the meeting to order and led us in the Pledge of Allegiance. Chuck Brictson led in the singing of the American and Norwegian Anthems.

Guests included Kathy Peterson, Anita Fletcher (Don Olson's sister) and Janet and Ruth from Stillwater MN who were guests of the Lesteruds.

"Et Amerikansk Besok", a program by Don Olson, included pictures taken when he was in Norway in 2015. He visited his family farms there.

The Secretary and Financial Reports were approved as written. *Note:* President Olson noted that confidential information (ie. members' birth-days financial reports, etc.) will only be included in the newsletter to Lodge members. Other recipients will receive a revised edition.

We viewed the plaques received at the International Convention for District Large Lodge and for the Founder's Award given for our increase in growth of 7% for 2016.

It was also noted that we are in need of President and Vice President nominees for 2017.

New Business: Masse Moro Camp costs will increase from \$700 to \$800 next year. District 5 has begun a fundraiser with a book—"*Hidden Heroes*"— which gives eyewitness accounts of the German occupation of Norway during WWII. They are being sold for \$20 each with the profits going to the Camp. The motion was made by Arlys Olson that we give a \$500 donation to Masse Moro. It was seconded by Audrey Severson.

Discussion followed about our upcoming Christmas Party which will be held at the Lesterud home on Saturday December 10th at 5:00 PM. Our regular scheduled meeting for December will be on Monday, December 26th. We will begin with our annual visit to Parkview Care Center for singing to the residents at 6:00 PM. Afterwards, we will go to the Parish Hall at Zion for our potluck meal. It was suggested that we think of a little gift to give each of the residents.

Financial Adviser Tom Kunkel gave an update on Sons of Norway's insurance plans. A drawing for prizes followed.

President Olson made note of the article in the *Woodville Leader* about our September music concert.

Our next Lodge meeting will be Monday, Nov. 28th, featuring a Norwegian video describing cheese making in Norway.

Viking Cats Rode The Seas

A vision of Viking sailors braving the seas for parts unknown probably doesn't conjure up thoughts of furry feline shipmates. However, a new genetic study reveals that cats likely accompanied the Vikings on their travels.

Evolutionary geneticist Eva-Maria Geigl and colleagues Claudio Ottoni and Thierry Grance presented the study findings at the International Symposium on Biomolecular Archaeology. Although domesticated cats have a long relation with humans, little is known about the origins of their ancient ancestors. In the first study of its kind, scientists compared DNA samples from over 200 ancient cats that lived between 15,000 years ago and the 1700s. Study findings point to two waves of growth in cat populations—one in early Mediterranean farming communities as far back as 12,000 years ago and a second thousands of years later as felines from Egypt spread across Africa and Asia. Sequenced DNA results indicate a common lineage from cats in Egypt to cat remains found as far north as a Viking burial site in northern Germany. Christian Koch Madsen with the National Museum in Nuuk. Greenland, echoes the study findings pointing to archaeological evidence of cats in Greenland. "They must have come aboard Viking ships, he told ScienceNordic."

Dissolve Jello in water. Add sugar, frozen raspber

ries and lemon juice. Stir berries until separated

RASPBERRY RIBBON SALAD

Jello Mixture: 1—6oz pkg. raspberry Jello

1/2 cup sugar

2 -1/2 cups boiling water

2—10 oz. pkgs frozen raspberries

2 T. lemon juice

Topping: 1 pkg. graham crackers (22 squares), 2 tbsps. sugar and 3/4 stick of butter. Crumble crackers. Add sugar and melted butter. Mix well and set aside.

Cream: 8ozs. softened cream cheese, 2/3 cup powdered sugar, 2 tsps. vanilla 1/2 tsp. salt and 1 pint of cream (whipped).

Mix the cream cheese, powdered sugar, vanilla and the whipped cream.

Assemble by alternating layers of the Jello mixture and the cream mixture in a glass bowl.

Top with the crumbled cracker topping and refrigerate until serving.
