#### 2023-2024 Scholarship Application

Vennelag Lodge is offering a \$1,000 scholarship to an applicant who is a member of or has a parent/grandparent who is a member of the Vennelag 5-513 Lodge. This scholarship is available to a high school graduate, a student currently attending an accredited post-secondary school or technical college or a student who has chosen to postpone further education and now plans to begin attending an accredited post-secondary school or technical college.

The applicant needs to submit the following criteria:

- Transcript showing successful completion of high school or previous semester in post-secondary
- Successful enrollment in an accredited post-secondary school or Technical School for the fall semester
- Evidence of maintaining a 2.5 GPA or better while in high school or post-secondary.

These items, official school transcript and a copy of the acceptance letter, **must be** submitted with this application. Payment will be sent to the school of choice.
