

## **Hiking In Donald County Park**

The Spring Hike: **10:00 AM, Saturday May 31, 2014** Meet at Pop's Knoll (about 5 miles south of Mt. Horeb on Hwy. 92) for a panoramic view of the area we will hike through. From the Knoll we will drive the short distance back to Sutter Drive and the fishing access parking lot where the hike begins. This rather easy hike of about 1.5 miles does have some irregular terrain; sturdy footwear is essential.

The first segment of the trail is along the banks of Deer Creek; a class A trout stream. We will pause frequently, for a full range of sensory input: bird calls, gentle breezes, insect or frog sounds, flowing water, and a variety of plants. From the point where the Deer Creek trail ends there are several options; we will turn right and continue through a wooded area eventually

leading into prairies. Our attention will, again, be drawn to sights and sounds that include rock outcrops, a variety of trees and other plants and, with a bit of luck, the sound of a piliated woodpecker "hammering" on a tree trunk. A close look at and careful examination of: flower buds, leaves, mushrooms, moss, rocks and other objects can be rewarding. Gently overturning small logs often reveals some interesting life forms; be sure to return the log to its original position.

We will pause, briefly, at Larson Pond then take a peek into a blue bird house. If done with care, eggs or young birds can be observed close-up while the parent birds wait patiently for the intruders to leave. A short walk around a wooded knoll will bring us back to the parking place.

#### Rain date: Saturday, June 07.

Watch the Newsletter for details about a fall Hike tentatively scheduled for September. This will be along some rather demanding trails totaling about 3.5 miles. The reward will be: scenic vistas, an Historic Cabin site, two large springs, a broad expanse of prairie, blue bird sightings, forests and more.

## **Midsummer in Scandinavia**

Midsummer is Scandinavia's most popular festival right along with Christmas. A traditional celebration of the Summer solstice, Midsummer is the longest day of the year (June 21). In Sweden, Midsummer is even celebrated as a national holiday (also see <u>Scandinavian national holidays</u>).
