The Mount Horeb Community Center had a washable floor installed which will promote cleanliness and enable easier care for all groups who us the space.



Torild Homstad has announced that Cameron Penne, a former recipient of the Vennelag's High School Scholarship and now a UW-Platteville engineering student, has been awarded an <u>International Summer School Scholarship</u>. Penne will study at the University of Oslo, where he is required to take six hours of classes each day. Penne will study Norwegian history and Norwegian language. The course will cover migrations to Norway, social, political, and mythical traditions of the Viking period, the formation of the medieval Christian kingdom, the Black Death, the Kalmar Union, the Lutheran Reformation and wars of the Dano-Norwegian kingdom.

The second half of the course covers folk culture, economy, economic and political crises of the Interwar years, WWII, the welfare state, and Norway's relationships with Europe and the world.

Tim has also been in contact with the new Chamber Executive Director, Tiffany King. The Chamber spearheaded this project and was the recipient of donations from many sources.

It was decided to generate a letter from the Chamber which will be sent to all donors and interested parties about the current status of the project. Craig and Tim will be going to the quarry to pick out the main rocks/boulders for the face and fingers as soon as the weather provides us the opportunity. We will then get them into position at the quarry to get a better understanding for moving logistics, machinery needed, etc.

Known as Syttende Mai, May 17marks Norwegian National Day, the day Norway's Constitution was signed in 1814, in effect declaring the country an independent kingdom.

Here are a few facts about Syttende Mai, according to Aftenposten:

- 1. For a long time, The Constitution Day was celebrated on the 4<sup>th</sup> of November. After parting ways with Sweden in 1905, Norway resumed its' celebrations on 17<sup>th</sup> of May.
- 2. For the first decades, only boys were allowed to participate in the children's parade.
- 3. The first recorded 17. Mai celebrations were in... Denmark.
- 4. "Ja, vi elsker" is not the official national hymn.
- 5. Norway is not the only country celebrating 17.Mai. Nauru, a tiny Pacific island state also celebrates its Constitution Day.
- 6. Booming ice cream sales! Syttende Mai is undoubtedly the best day for ice cream sellers in Norway.
- 7. The weather on 17. May varies a lot!
- 8. Peak-hour to watch the celebrations on TV is at 10.42 am.
- 9. A total sausage fest. Sausage sales jump almost 120 percent. While grilled sausage is preferred by most, many are very fond of <a href="Wienerpølser">Wienerpølser</a> ( Wiener sausages)

# AND THE WINNERS ARE...

### Karen Eberhardt – Chili Cookoff



#### Tequilla-limeTurkey Chili

1 tbsp. vegetable oil 2 lbs. ground turkey (93% lean)
2 onions, chopped fine 2 – 15 oz. can kidney beans-rinsed
1 red bell pepper-chopped 1 – 28 oz. can diced tomatoes
1/4 C. chili powder 1 – 28 oz. can crushed tomatoes

6 garlic cloves, minced 2 cups chicken broth

1 tbsp. ground cumin
2 tsp. ground coriander
1 tbsp. honey
1 tsp. dried oregano

water as needed

salt to taste

- 1. Heat oil in Dutch oven over medium heat until shimmering. Add onions, bell pepper, chili powder, garlic, cumin, coriander, oregano. Cook, stirring often until vegetables are softened, about 10 minutes. I added some water to help cook.
- 2. Add turkey and break into pieces with spatula, increase heat to medium-high. Cook until no longer pink, about 4 minutes.
- 3. Stir in beans, tomatoes with juice and broth. Bring to a simmer. Reduce heat to medium low and simmer until it starts to thicken, about 1 hour.
- 4. Add tequilla and honey. Continue to simmer until turkey is tender and chili is slightly thickened, about 40 minutes.
- 5. Season with salt to taste. SERVE!
- \*Can be refrigerated for up to 3 days or frozen for up to 1 month. If frozen, thaw completely in refrigerator.
- \*To reheat, bring chili,m covered, to gentle simmer, stirring often; adjust consistency with hot water as needed.

#### **SUGAR AND SPICE COOKIES**

¾ cup shortening2 cups flour1 cup sugar2 tsp. baking soda¼ cup molasses½ tsp. salt

1 egg ½ tsp. each cinnamon, cloves, ginger

Mix well in order. Roll into small balls. Then roll balls in a small dish of sugar. Place 2 inches apart on a greased pan and bake for about 12 minutes at 350 degrees.

These cookies flatten out and bake with cracks or furrows on the top. Easy and good!
