

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District 5 Convention June 19-22, 2024 - HOW DO I BECOME A DELEGATE?

- 1. Be sure my dues are paid.
- 2. Check my calendar to be sure I am free from June 19-22, 2024.
- 3. When my lodge announces the date for election of delegates, I need to place my name on the list of candidates or ask someone to nominate me.
- 4. Let other members know I am interested and ask them to vote for me.
- 5. If elected, celebrate!
- 6. That's all there is to it!

WHAT ABOUT ALTERNATES?

- 1. An alternate is elected for each delegate. In case the delegate is unable to fulfill their duty, the alternate fills in.
- 2. An alternate may be called upon at very short notice, but should be available if needed.*
- 3. An alternate may be elected to replace a specific delegate or be in line as first, second, third, etc order *if needed*. It is very important to have alternates so a lodge is represented in case of an unexpected situation. *If the registration fee has been paid, and a hotel reservation has been made, the registration would apply to the alternate; the delegate and alternate should make personal arrangements to transfer the hotel room to the alternate so they could have the group room rate.

3 Tips for Preserving Cherished Family Heirlooms

No matter their condition, it is a joy to display your heirlooms and share the memories they evoke. Here are a few tips on caring for your heirlooms:

- Keep heirlooms out of bright sunlight and away from heat sources to avoid fading.
- Clean surfaces gently, using soft cloths.
 - Dust wooden furniture and apply a
 beeswax-based polish up to twice a
 year. Clean painted wooden items with a damp
 cloth, then wipe dry. Avoid silicone polishes and abrasive or ammoniabased cleaners on wood, silver, pottery, or painted/gilded glass.
 - Clean pottery with a soft sponge. Wash silver in hot soapy water, then dry and buff.
- Vintage textiles are too delicate for the gentlest machine wash.
 - Water may damage silk or wool items, and wet embroidery can bleed dyes. Spot cleaning may be your best option. Always test a small area first. Experts recommend a gentle, neutral-pH detergent like Orvus Paste for cleaning old fabrics.
 - Old stains and yellowing may be impossible to remove. To minimize discoloration, use cotton bags and avoid storing textiles in plastic bags or containers.



Whenever you get a link in an e-mail a good tip from IT people I work with is to take your mouse/clicker and hoover on the link, wait for your computer to think about where it's taking you and see if you can find a difference in the link that you were sent in the e-mail and what the computer is reading.


If there is any difference **DO NOT CLICK** as this is most likely spam/hackers. If you see no difference between the two it is a safe link to click. I do this for every link that I get even ones from people that I usually e-mail with because hackers/bad actors have been known to dress-up their e-mails to pretend to be people that are familiar.

As you can see with the next picture the link and where my computer says that it will take me are the same (see the drawn green arrow) so this link is good to follow/click.



After getting to the SignUpGenius site you will see something like the next picture, we are using a subscription that doesn't block Ads so as you are looking at the site with your computer you will notice them on the sides of the screen. Also this site is available to be used on your smart phone but same thing applies —make sure that it's a safe link before you navigate to it and there will be many ads to navigate through.




Once you reviewed the entire list you will click on the button that says Sign Up on the right to the item or volunteer selection that you are able to donate/contribute then you will get the below screen. This is where you can see that Butter is now not showing Sign Up on the right anymore but a checkmark/Selected button. To confirm selections you must click on the bottom button —Save & Continue.




This will take you to the next screen which is where you will list an e-mail so that you can get reminder e-mails for what you have signed up to bring and work.

On this screen you can add in a comment which you will put in details like shown so we can make sure that we have everything covered for the events.




After you finalize your sign up by clicking the Sign Up Now button and getting an account set up you will get the final screen this is a confirmation. That means that you are finished!



You are able to sign up for many items in one submission but you can also sign up by going through this process for each item that you are looking to donate/volunteer for.

Do you have a Tine? Do you know what Tine is? Tine (spoken -Tee-na) is usually a hand crafted box-like container that is distinctively Scandinavian. These containers can be small or rather large depending on what they were intended to be used for when they were made.

Many of these containers were used as lunch boxes for those that were handed down in the family. A few of these containers were adorned with Rosemaling or even carved which makes them even more precious to the family.



So your family is doing spring cleaning and have found a pile of family photos, are you sitting there smiling at the photos or are you scratching your head at who is in the picture?

If you are in the later group there are a few things that you can do to help figure out a few things.

First take in the entire photo - what are they wearing in the photo?

Little things like the style of hat or the collar height on the ladies garb. This will help you narrow down the era or a couple choices of years to research further.

Second is there anything on the back of the photo -my family has a habit of putting names on the back of the photo. Depending on who wrote the names they may be exactly on the back of the person's image or they are still a guessing game as who goes to which name. Also many of the photographers had their names printed on the back of the photo which will help if you enlist a genealogical society to further narrow down the time period.

Third take on the photo -is the background a familiar scene or building that is locally famous? Many times looking behind the figures to see if there are unique buildings that

may help you and a local genealogical society figure out where the photo was taken.

Lastly if you are fortunate to still have older family members, enlist their memory to narrow down who is in the photo.

Now that you've figured out who was in the photo and where it was taken what's the next step?

Depending on how significant the photos are to your family you may consider making digital copies to save on a genealogical program for future generations or make extra copies to put into an album while the originals go into a secure box.

When storing originals remember that historic photos are like a good piece of chocolate - they don't like heat/light and humidity and man-handling. Good thing is that they won't leave your fingers in need of a wash but the bad thing about those old photos is they don't like us handling them so try to handle them as little as possible. To store the photos in the best possible way look for acid-free items to keep the photos in the best condition.
