Can a group of Norwegians find happiness in Monroe, home of so many Swiss descendants?

Marion Boynton initiated the formation of the Ostestaden Lodge of Monroe, Wisconsin. She was a member of Vennelag in Mount Horeb, but she did not like driving at night, so she sent a postcard to International Headquarters in Minneapolis, asking why they could not have a Sons of Norway Lodge in Monroe, Wisconsin. Officials in the Fifth District Lodge responded by assisting in the formation of our new lodge.

The "Original Five" (Marion Boynton, Edith and LeRoy Severson, Ancil Norland and Gaylord Swenson) met with Jon Grinde, Fifth District President and Hjalmer (Jolly) Hanson, a member of the Fifth District board, at the Grace Lutheran Church of Monroe to discuss forming a new lodge in Monroe.

A temporary slate of officers was named. Chairperson: Ancil Norland, Secretary: Edith Severson, Co-Treasurers: LeRoy Severson and Gaylord Swenson.

After several planning meetings with Jolly Hanson (Nordland Lodge), the Ostestaden Lodge was formally installed on June 14, 1996 at Grace Lutheran Church in Monroe. "Ostestaden" means "cheese place." After a bountiful potluck supper, Fifth District officers Jon Grinde, Fifth District President and George Sievers, and Jolly Hanson officiated at the installation of the new lodge.

The Ostestaden Lodge Charter Banquet took place in New Glarus on October 26, 1996 with 57 members and friends attending. This date happened to be the one-year anniversary of the first meeting in Monroe on October 26, 1995 of the "Original Five."

Fifth District President, Jon Grinde presented the charter, which included 69 names to Ostestaden President, Paul Nelson. Also officiating were International Director George Sievers and Jolly Hanson of Nordland Lodge 544 in Janesville. New members were initiated in the traditional Sons of Norway ceremony. District 5 Vice President Jostein Bakken was also in attendance.

Frozen fish skin side down, cover and steam 7 minutes
Season with lemon and pepper or your choice
Steam 5 more minutes

## **Book club:** *Dancing the Cows Home*

Ostestaden Book Club met January 21<sup>st</sup> at the home of Elaine and Bill Bethke.

The book brings back lots of memories for those growing up on the farm in the 50s and 60s. It follows the family of twin sisters, Sara and Suzie. Mom loves her cows and is the real force behind the success of the farm. Dad is a hard worker and active, but really wishes he could have gone to college and traveled.

We follow the twins who need to be together constantly to play tricks on schoolmates and teachers. They dance the cows home. As teens Susie discovers she has real talent as a pianist and the whole family sacrifices so she can develop her skills. Though frugality is the family virtue, the parents go into debt to buy a piano for Susie and pay for music lessons and trips to competitions. Sister Sara is happy for her twin, but feels neglected and ordinary and jealous. Sara pushes the rules and takes unwise chances to express her independence.

This is a true story and photos throughout are actual family memories which help the reader to relate to the family. We also identify with living in a rural area in a small town. Most have relatives who lived on the farm.

After discussion about our memories and comparisons to the book, everyone enjoyed coffee and cherry pie.
