# Birkebeiner News

Birkie Fever was alive and well in Hayward, WI, when over 500 children stopped by the registration tent to get their number assignments, race bibs, and ties. They checked in with Birkie volunteers Aldeen Fjelstad and Cheryl Wille-Schlesser, representing Vennelag Lodge and District 5 Sons of Norway. Later, they strapped into their skis and set off across Lake Hayward for the downtown finish line. The Barnebirkie (Children's Ski Race) was held on February 19<sup>th</sup>. The entrance fee of \$10.00 brought with it bragging rights and the reward of cookies available in the Swiss Miss tent at the end of the race! Despite the drizzle and cold temperatures, the children left the starting area at 12:30 PM to the chants of *Let us, go! Let us go!* The official count on the number of skiers this year at the Barnebirkie is 850!

Children who were participating in the Bitty Birkie, ages 2.5 to 5 or youngest skiing division, were accompanied by their parents who walked by their side. Those who were older had the option of skiing a 1.2K or 3K race. Parents were required to ski behind these children. A challenge for all this year was crossing a huge bridge built over Hwy. 63 in downtown Hayward. Students from Birnamwood High School were on hand to assist the little ones with this last leg of the race.

Sons of Norway Lodges from across District 5 sent cookies of many kinds and workers who helped to distribute them. The last count was over 800 dozen, but my guess is there were many more. Final totals are forthcoming. Once all had their fill, extra cookies were taken to the Ski Expo being held at Hayward High School. Former District 5 President Mary Bennett and her sister Asta of Idun Lodge, Madison, were on hand to greet skiers and to offer a treat or a hot cup of Norwegian coffee. Aldeen and Cheryl joined them later in the afternoon and assisted with clean-up. Remaining packaged cookies were given to the Hayward Food Pantry where they will be distributed to needy families.

Thank you one and all for your cookie donations and support of this worthy event. If you would like to witness the Birkie for yourself next year, the dates of the 2017 Birkie are February 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>. #### **TUBFRIM**

Save used stamps and expired or used phone cards for Tubfrim to help disabled children and youth in Norway. Cut leaving about ¼ inch around each stamp on all sides. Bring them to a lodge meeting.

#### **Tubfrim Winner Announced**

For the past 30 years, members have been clipping canceled postage stamps and sending them to Tubfrim, who then sells them to dealers and collectors.

Originally the money raised went to help children afflicted by tuberculosis. Since tuberculosis is no longer the threat to health that it once was, today the proceeds from the resale of stamps helps improve the quality of life for children and youth with disabilities and special needs. Sons of Norway members are the largest contributor outside of Norway to Tubfrim's efforts, sending nearly 30% of all stamps collected.

While helping children is a great motivation for our members to participate, there is a special incentive to say "thank you". For every pound of stamps collected, the member or lodge can enter a drawing, held in mid-January every year, to win a round trip ticket to Norway, worth up to \$1,000.

Thursday, January 14, 2016 was a lucky day for Vegas Viking Lodge 6-152. The lodge was the winner of the Tubfrim drawing. Their postcard was drawn from among 1,331 other cards. With one card for every pound sent to Norway that means that Sons of Norway sent at least 1,332 pounds of stamps to Tubfrim in 2015. Vegas Vikings contributed 220 pounds to that total.
