2016 Convention: Great news, Wednesday I signed the contract with Hotel Marshfield for our 2016 Convention. Now we can begin moving forward with plans for the convention.

Happy Thanksgiving: I hope everyone had a happy Thanksgiving. My wife and I spent ours in VA with our daughter and her husband, and our two grandchildren Heidi and Harrison. Our son Knut also came down from NYC. One highlight was Heidi's birthday party with a dozen 3 year olds.

Work: As many of you know my work is part time and varies from little to full time. This month I spent several days in Madison working at the university. I almost got to Idun's lodge meeting, and Stoughton's lodge meeting, but work was not going well, and I ended up working late.

Lodge Demos: Our lodge participated in an open house at the Marshfield library on Sunday November 16. Over 400 people dropped by, and we may have gotten one new member.

Conference Calls: I've wanted to try using telephone conferences to bring our board and lodges closer together, but I did not know how to implement this. Our three conference calls about our 2016 convention, aside from fulfilling our board resolution approving our convention site, did provide useful feedback and I hope kept everyone informed. So how did we do? Let me know what you thought about the conference calls, and whether we should use them again and under what circumstances.

Other districts are also exploring using conference calls. One district plans to skype into zone meetings with the district president. We could also try that or use facetime or google hang outs, so that I could spend a few minutes with zone meetings or even local lodge meetings without traveling long distances. Let me know if anyone wants to try this and we can test out our connections.

District Presidents Council, DPC: The DPC meets twice a year along with the International Board meeting. The fall DPC meeting was November 14 and 15 in Minneapolis. Each district presents a summary of their activities to the IB. I sent everyone a copy of our report earlier, and George put it up on our website. The DPC spends the two days discussing items of mutual interest, and interacts with the IB.

One item concerned bonding of district officers who sign checks. Sons of Norway has insurance to \$10,000 to cover district and local

officers, but for coverage of amounts over \$10K each district board or local lodge will need to purchase additional coverage.

Another item the IB and staff talked about was lodge initiatives. There are several initiatives including 1) lodge improvements, 2) district recruiting, 3) lodge revitalization, and 4) new lodge starts. If a district or lodge incurs expenses under one of these topics, they may ask for reimbursement from the IB. If anyone wants more information, they can contact Linda Pederson.

The IB, the DPC, and committees participated in the ongoing strategic planning. At the international convention in August, the delegates were introduced to Sons of Norway strategic planning. The overall theme is the Sons of Norway is actually three parts of a whole: Fraternal (lodge activities), Financial (insurance and annuities), and Foundation (giving back to members). Most Sons of Norway members do not know how these different parts are interconnected. By promoting understanding of Sons of Norway, it is believed we will increase membership and make SofN stronger. To do this 4 committees were established: Cat 1 3F's, Cat 2 Leadership Recruitment, Cat 3 Lodge Programs, and Cat 4 Membership Structure. We participated in a workshop to plan the next actions for each of the committees or Categories. The results are: Cat 1 market the 3F's and create metrics, Cat 2 use technology to create short videos on leadership topics and place them on SofN website, Cat 3 Lodge Program Revitalization, and Cat 4 simplify dues structure. The committees will continue creating action plans and timelines.

Our VP Diane is knowledgeable about strategic planning. She will look at the SofN strategic planning and determine what is applicable to our district planning.

Another item consisted of a follow up to the nominating committee bylaw change approved at the International convention in August. The DPC chair asked me to explain what was meant by a metric to evaluate the board and candidates to the board. I created a metric based on our candidate application form, and presented it to the DPC. Then, when the DPC presented our district reports to the IB, I also presented this metric and evaluation to the IB. I did not know how it would be received, but it appeared that the IB was happy with the presentation. Our attorney said that this was a 'big deal' and that 'self evaluation like this would be well received by regulators.'

Board Visit: Both Cindy Olsen and Linda Pederson will be attending our spring board meeting. This will allow us to get an update on lodge initiatives and foundation work.

District Theme: The strategic planning at the IB level has come up with a theme for SofN, the 3F's. We as a district board have several plans to move the district forward, but I think we need to vocalize our plans with a theme. Based on VP Diane's presentation to our board at our October board meeting, I was wondering of 'Building Bridges' might be a reasonable theme for our two year board term until the next convention. Let me know what you think.

December visits: I plan to visit Fosselyngen on December 6, and Norway II on December 14. Send me an invitation if you want me to visit your zone meeting or lodge meeting.

Treasurer: Duane has been filling in as treasurer, but he will step down February 1. A new treasurer must come from the board, so if any officer or zone director is interested or willing to step into the position of treasurer, please let me know.

District Secretary's Report- January 2015—Darlene Arneson

Change- Where would we be without it? If our lodges don't change, we become stagnant and our membership numbers and participation reflect it. If we don't change individually, we become complacent and happy with things "just the way they are".

Sons of Norway offers many ways for us to address and implement changes. That doesn't mean we have to throw away or stop all current activities. But it does mean that we need to take time to evaluate what we are doing as a Lodge, District and International; how our lodge operations are handled; how we recruit, retain and engage members in Sons of Norway; and how we as individuals make the most of our membership. In our lodge, we continue to remind ourselves that we must take care of all members- those that are older who have been with us over the years, our new members that are just joining, those that can participate in events, and those that are homebound or live farther away. All are important!

To help address and learn about changes, I encourage you to consider the following:

- 1. Help your members learn how to log into the **Members Only Section** of the www.sofn.com website and check their contact information. By doing so, they will learn how to update their information and it provides an excellent opportunity to explore the resources on the International website.
- 2. For Lodge Secretaries: The Webinar for all lodge secretaries to learn more about the event and hour tracking website will be held January 22nd, at 7:00 pm Central time. Look for an invite to arrive by email from Sherry Gorse of Membership Services. Also, the AFA suggests that you use Google Chrome or FireFox when accessing the site. There have been some problems when using the Microsoft Browser.
- 3. Read the Sons of Norway Viking Resource- this is produced bi-monthly by the home office. You can get an email notification of its availability and back issues are in the Members Only section of the www.sofn.com website. It is literally full of excellent information that will keep you current about new activities, reports and opportunities.
- 4. Read the board minutes and other reports in *The Viking*. They are published to help our leadership understand what is being handled above the lodge level.
- 5. Involve your zone directors! Even though I am also a District Board member, I still rely on my zone director to remind me of deadlines, to help us with issues, or to brainstorm ideas. If you haven't been contacted by your zone director, then invite them to a lodge meeting or activity and discuss what your lodge's needs are. We are there to help you!

- Keep up on upcoming deadlines for various District activities (i.e. Barnebirkie, scholarships, Masse Moro), International (i.e. grant deadlines, scholarships, required reports).

PASS IT ON

As we continue providing feedback to our members and our communities through newsletters, photos, articles, and other even more creative ways, perhaps it is time to think of why we want to do this. I am constantly reminded in my Artist-in-Residence work of the importance of passing our enthusiasm onto the next generation and our future Sons of Norway members. We can't live forever you know.

A book called Finding Joy by Charlotte Davis Kasl has this to say about 'passing it on'.

"If you want to leave a legacy of comfort and joy for your children, pass on to them the stories of your life and your heritage. Alex Haley, an African American, was able to write *Roots*-an account of his ancestors' abduction into slavery and the subsequent generations that survived in the United States-because each generations was told to pass on the stories of their lives. Native American as well can return to the circle of their own spirituality and traditions because people secretly kept the traditional knowledge alive during long periods of terrible oppression.

Whether your children are little or grown, write down or record stories from your life-the traditions, your heritage, your beliefs. Include something about your feelings, thoughts, conflicts, joys and heartaches as well. Your children may not be interested at this moment, but a time may come when they will want to know about you, the person, the child, the daughter, the son, the scared one, the brave one. And if you write most of it, record your voice so they can have the remembrance of your voice. Your grandchildren will enjoy it as well.

Recently I came across a five-page account my mother had written of her first two years of married life. A strong sense of her presence touched my heart as I read it. She recounts the times when my father was a district forest ranger north of Yellowstone Park and they rode horseback throughout the area checking out forestry cabins. These stories are a link back to her I would never have had if she hadn't written them down because she never told me about those times.


After my father died, I looked for a short article he had written many years earlier on his spiritual beliefs. I was entranced because it gave me a connection to his inner world that I had seldom known. It was a comfort and a blessing to have it, and I saw how much I had absorbed his spiritual values.

We grow up thinking of our parents as just parents. Then one day, we ask, "Who are you?" Whatever your history, it is part of your child's legacy. By passing on the stories of your life you help your children connect with the circle of their heritage."

The Sarah L. Paulsen Memorial Scholarship Fund

In August 1995 eight year old Sarah Paulsen of our lodge passed away.

Because Sarah was very involved with the Sons of Norway, and was fascinated with her family's background and with Norwegian culture, friends and family, along with the Scandiana Lodge felt a scholarship established in Sarah's name would be appropriate.

The scholarship will not only carry on her love for the Norwegian Heritage, but will also enable other children to have the opportunity to attend the Sons of Norway Heritage Camp in Eau Claire, in honor of Sarah.

The scholarship will cover one quarter of the camp cost.

Parents may be concerned that getting this scholarship would prevent them from utilizing the District 5 Matching Fund Grant, but this award will have no bearing on other matching funds. This scholarship could be given in addition to District 5 and Local Lodge Matching Fund Scholarships. However, if the applicant's Local Lodge is financially unable to give their children Matching Fund Scholarships, the Sarah Paulsen Scholarship would qualify them for the District 5 Matching Fund Scholarship.

Rules:

- 1. The scholarship is open to any child age 9-15, who is interested in learning about the language and culture of Norway.
- 2. The applicant must be a heritage member or a child or grandchild of a Sons of Norway member, and belonging to a District 5 Lodge.
- 3. The applicant will write an essay of no more than 500 words. The topic is "Why I believe it is important to know about our heritage" or "Why I want to attend Norwegian Heritage Camp".
- 4. All applicants will complete a brief application form.
- 5. Applicant will include 2 letters of reference, including one from a local Lodge officer.
- 6. Applications must be postmarked before April 15. Decisions will be made by May 1, and winners will be notified by mail. Checks will be issued and mailed directly to the Scholarship Recipient before June 1.
- 7. Judges will be the Scandiana 600 Sarah L Paulsen Memorial Scholarship Fund Committee.

The **Polar Star Book Club** members are also members of The Sons of Norway Polar Star Lodge 5-472, a fraternal organization, whose mission is to promote Norwegian culture and heritage. The Book Club was started in January 2011 as part of the 50th Anniversary Celebration of the Lodge. The anniversary year goal of the Lodge was to participate in the Sons of Norway Culture Skills Program and earn medals in Norwegian and Norwegian-North American Literature. The Polar Star Book Club met one hour before the monthly Lodge meetings on the first Sunday of the month at St.Olaf Lutheran Church in Montgomery, II. Starting in January of 2015 the group has been moved to Panera on Orchard Road the Wednesday following a Lodge meeting at 6:00p.m. to allow for discussion that is uninterrupted by other Lodge responsibilities.

The Polar Star Book Club has read a wide variety of books. TUBFRIM HISTORY

Postmaster Ditlef Frantzen in Nesbyen established TUBFRIM in 1928. The aim was to collect and sell used stamps and use the proceeds to aid the eradication of TB among Norwegian children. The first profit was made in 1929 and amounted to NOK 1,500. Profits varied in the following years. TUBFRIM has made good progress since , NOK 150,000 in 1970 to NOK 650,000 in 2009.
