Folk Art Exhibit/Competition

The District 5 Convention is fast approaching, and the deadline for entrees in the Folk Art Exhibit/Competition is June 16. Please send me the registration form. Hopefully we will have enough room to attach the forms to this Ole Bull, but you can also find the forms on the District 5 website. The easiest way to find them on the website is to search on folk Art Exhibit/Competition. If nothing else, just drop me an email and let me know you plan to bring an entry for either the competition or the exhibit. My email is <u>owen.christianson@gmail.com.</u> In addition here is additional information that came out of our District board meeting in April, and meetings with convention personnel:

. The Folk Art room will open Thursday, June 26th at 8AM to receive entrees.

The room will be closed Thursday afternoon for judging. The room will be open to the public

Friday June 27 (9AM - 5:30PM) and Saturday June 28 (AM-Noon).

. The deadline for entering items is 8 AM to 10 AM Thursday June 26.

. Items must be picked up between noon and 2PM Saturday, June 28.

. Items may be removed from the room only by the person listed on the id form after showing

a photo id. (Some items are irreplaceable and are valuable).

. Security will be provided whenever the room is open.

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. Ribbons will be awarded to 1^{st} , 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} place, blue, red, and white for each category and level of expertise, we may award multiple 1^{st} , 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} places in specific categories.

. There will be a People's Choice award. Each person upon entering the room will ve given 5 beans which they can deposit in cups by each entry. The entry with the most beans at noon on Saturday wins the People's choice.

. The prize will be a replica Viking bowl, which I will make. To my knowledge, this will be an almost unique prize since there are very few people making replica Viking Bowls. (To a certain extent, each person will be on the honor system, and will only take 5 beans once, not each time they enter the room.). . At this competition District 5 will start a medalist program. All competitors will automatically be entered in the medalist program. Each 1^{st} , 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} place will accrue points toward a medal.

. In addition, some exhibitors may want to sell their items. SoN District 5 can not be involved in any sale. Any sale will be solely between the artist and the purchaser.

Please consider entering something in the exhibition even if you do not wish to compete. This is a great way to share our arts and crafts with our fellow lodge members.

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Sons of Norway District 5 2014 Folk Art Exhibit and Competition

The Sons of Norway District 5 is pleased to invite all members to participate in the 2014 Folk Art Exhibit and Competition to be held at its District convention in Lake Lawn Resort in Delavan, Wisconsin on June 25-28, 2014.

On-site registration will take place on Thursday June 26, from 8:00 to 10:00 am.

Entries must fall into one of the following categories: . Rosemaling . Norwegian weaving . Hardanger embroidery . Norwegian themed needlework(e.g. klosersom, diamantsom and other traditional needle work)

- . Hand knitting with Norwegian design
- . Crocheting and tatting
- . Figure carving with Norwegian theme using hand tools only
- . Relief carving with Norwegian theme using hand tools only
- . Chip carving using hand tools
- . Bentwood using hand tools
- . Wood turning: bowl
- . Wood turning: spindle
- . Genealogy

. Other with Norwegian theme (e.g. photography, paintings, stained glass, kolrosing, etc)

There are five classes for each category:

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. Advanced, Intermediate, and Beginner. There will no longer be adult professional or adult amateur classes. These classes will be determined by previous performance in the Folk Arts Competition, therefore for this time only all entries start at Beginner, unless the Judges promote an entry one level to the Intermediate class.

. Youth Ages 16-20

. Children- Heritage members and children/grandchildren of current Sons of Norway members, 15 years old and under are eligible for exhibition only. They will all receive a Certificate of Participation. The registration form and waiver of responsibility should be sent to me by June 16, 2014.

Genealogy Competition

The competition has three categories.

1. Pictorial family trees of at least four generations.

This category will be judged on creativity and completeness and ease of reading.

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5 points will be given for creativity. This includes style of tree chosen, use of photographs or other graphic elements, style of font and how they integrate together.

3 points for completeness of dates of birth, death and marriage

2 points for ease of reading. Viewer should be able to easily read and identify each generation.

2. Family biography providing a narrative of information found in historical documents. The work should include references or notes to support all data given in the biography. The format should follow as close as possible the Genealogical Biography found in the

"Standards Manual of the Board for Certification of Genealogists." It should include Pictures and other graphics when possible to help the reader better understand and appreciate the family and the era. It must include four generations.

5 points will be given for completeness of references and notes used to support the data 3 points for the narrative flow

2 points for appropriate use of graphic materials

3. Family story book. This category includes any presentation of family history that includes narrative and pictures. It does not have to be referenced.

- 5 points will be given for creative approach to presenting the family history
- **3** points overall integration of material into a meaningful history
- 2 points for use of graphic materials
