



My lodge needed a program this month, so I came up with a 20 minute program on the book "Hidden Heroes: World War II in Norway." This program is attached as a PDF and as a Word document. I read #1 and #18, and arranged for six members who were good speakers to read the rest of the passages. Most of the people that I picked were relative new lodge members (2 years or less), as a way to engage some newer people in a lodge presentation.

These six people sat together and took turns reading after I read #1. For example, the first person read #2, #8, #14, the second person read #3, #9, #15...

They passed a microphone from person to person, so everyone in the room could hear them. When each person read one reading (#2 through #7), the microphone was passed back to the first person, who started again with reading #8.

When #17 was read, I took the microphone and read #18.
I then had two people pass out order forms and a few pens.

It's a little long, but the audience kept interested. If you want a very short promotion, you might only want two people other than yourself reading, and want to make it quick, DO: #1 (you), #3 (person A), #6 (B), #10 (A), #16 (B), #18 (you).
