## Zone Alignment Committee Survey Packet for the District's Input Due Sept. 1

Committee: Darlene Arneson (Chr), Karen Broadhead, Judy Ghastin, Sandy Olson and Kathy Secora

The Zone Alignment committee has met many times the past year to discuss possible ways to propose changes to our zones. We began this process two years ago in committee discussion. In February 2020 we sent out a survey to all District 5 lodge officers via the FFFN. We used the results in our discussion preparing for the spring District 5 Board Meeting and discussion during the meeting. The direction given during the meeting was to proceed with developing some options, getting feedback, and then move forward with some concrete ways to more evenly divide our District. We did another survey in May and received more feedback. We used that feedback, along with the discussion in March and April, and came up with various proposals that have been discussed by the committee and board during conference calls, and then changed, modified, or eliminated! We have four options for you to review and the fifth option is to do nothing. If adding another zone or an additional director to one zone if the preferred route, that leads to an expense to the District of additional board members for two board meetings, convention expenses, and other expenses zone directors incur. We have asked District Treasurer Mike Palecek for a financial impact for adding additional directors- it is estimated at \$2,900 per board member for a biennium.

We would like to invite the District to review four options plus the "don't do anything option" which we have narrowed down through many calls, emails, survey results, and discussion. We also have explored how to proceed and based on the recent referendum passed by the 2018 International Lodge to allow Districts conduct business via electronic communications, that we can make these changes without reconvening the delegate body in-person.

Any change would take effect at the District Lodge Meeting in June 2022 – on that Saturday when the delegates go to caucus. The delegates would be going to the new zones as they elect board members, alternates and delegates/alternates to the International Lodge meeting.

#### Our proposed timeline:

- 1. July- September 1- get feedback from lodge members, officers, and board
- 2. September- Committee meets to finalize a proposal for a district bylaw change
- 3. October Board Meeting- Board reviews the proposal and moves a motion to send it to the 2018 delegates (District Lodge) for action
- 4. November 1- send the proposed bylaw change to the delegates to vote
- 5. By December 31, 2020 complete the voting process on the bylaw change

We want to complete this process by early 2021 as the new nominating committee has to be elected at the spring board meeting (April 2021) of the year preceding the convention. The committee needs to know what the district and zones looks like to start their work.

# <u>Recent International Lodge Action giving the District the ability to</u> <u>electronically vote</u>

June 8, 2020

Greetings 2018-2022 International Lodge Members:

This is to notify you that the <u>referendum presented to you</u> (deadline May 8<sup>th</sup>) has **passed**.

As you recall the International Board asked you to give authority to the District Boards to conduct business with their delegates through electronic communications in addition to standard mail. (See **3.10.4.** of the Charter and Constitutions for current law).

The referendum passed unanimously! We had 102 electronic yes votes and 5 paper yes votes – for a total of 107. Unfortunately, this means that more than 40 of our International delegates did not vote at all. I would like to remind you that your participation in the governance of Sons of Norway is very important to our effective operation. Please give priority to acting upon the messages you receive from me and the International Board.

# District Bylaw section dealing with zones and how to change. They

don't have a provision for pandemics (cancelled District Lodge meetings and have not been changed since Nominating Committee rules have begun so the spring prior to the convention is not realistic and this should be changed as well!)

#### ARTIĆLE VI . . . ZONES

Par. 1 For the purpose of the election of representatives and alternates to the International Lodge, and members to the District Board of Directors, the District shall be divided into Zones by the District Lodge that will provide the most equal representation and provide for reasonable proximity between lodges. A new lodge shall be assigned to a Zone by the District President, subject to confirmation at the next District Lodge Meeting.

The District Board shall make a recommendation to the Lodge after reviewing the District population at the Spring Board Meeting prior to the Convention regarding the make-up of the Zone.

#### Par. 2 Description of Zones

Zone 1- Loven 29, Valkyrien 53, Trygvason 220, Viking 625, Ulseth 670, Dovre 353, and Sjoland 635 Zone 2- Wergeland 28, Jotunheimen 286, Solvang 457, Fossen 534, Fagernes 616, Rib Fjell 496, Elvedal 556, Norskeland 580, Myrmarken 609 and Vennligfolk 627.

Zone 3- Idun 74, Mandt 314, Vennelag 513, Nordland 544, Vakkertland 570, Ostestaden 642. and Norsemen of the Lakes 650.

Zone 4- Fosselyngen 82, Nordlyset 183, Hafrsfjord 206, Norse Valley 491, H R Holand 549, and Gronnvik 632.

Zone 5- Skjold 100, Valhall 168, Polar Star 472, Cleng Peerson 525, Trollhaugen 417 and Elvesund 593.

Zone 6- Nordkap 378, Samhold 473, Sonja Henie 490, Sognefjord 523, Christian Radich 568, Scandiana 600 Askeladden 610, Circle City 614, Edvard Grieg 657, Arctic Circle 662, Vikings of the Smokies 677 and Music City Vikings 681

#### ARTICLE XI . . . CHANGES OF THESE BY-LAWS

Par. 1 These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the District Lodge #5, provided notice thereof has been given to the District Secretary at least 45 days prior to the date of said meeting by any lodge in the District or has been submitted by the District Board of Directors. Proposed amendments originating in the local lodges, or by the District Board of Directors, must be submitted to the Chairman of the Laws Committee as soon as possible prior to the date of said meeting. The Laws Committee may recommend changes at the said meeting.

Par. 2 Any change must receive a 2/3 majority of the votes cast to become law.

All 999 (on-line sign-up) members pay the full \$60 in dues. If a person is using the SofN website to register a new member, you will see the \$60 dues provision.

Understanding the memberships of 000 financial members who purchase a financial product without embedded dues included have two options. If they join a local lodge, they pay the \$60 for a single membership. If they elect to not join a lodge, they pay \$24. However, one of the trade-offs is that without a Sons of Norway membership, they will not receive the Viking magazine. Receiving our award-winning publication is a great incentive to join a local lodge.

#### **Retention**

Consider conducting an exit interview with those members who opt to leave your lodge. Discover their cause for leaving and offer help and options. Revisit your lodge's Membership Satisfaction Survey. Reconvene your lodge's membership committee for further discussions.

#### Local Events

Consider holding a drive-thru event for any fall or winter food sales.

#### Virtual Meeting Ideas

- Watch an episode of the Nordic News, which is scheduled and maintained by District 5, Tuesday evenings at 6:20 PM, Central time.
- Ask members to share a personal antique or Norwegian family artifact.
- Contact a local specialist such as someone who raises Norwegian buhunds, Elkhunds or Norwegian forest cats.
