# From the District Nominating Committee

Dear President and Secretary,

God Jul og Godt Nytt År til alle sammen! Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to all!

You are leaders in your respective Sons of Norway lodges, and as such, much is expected of you. That is why I/we have chosen to communicate with you.

I am Jon M . Grinde, and I am writing on behalf of Mary Bennett, Tom Boudreau, and me. We were elected by the District Five Board of Directors to serve as the District Five Nominating Committee for 2016. The 2014 International Lodge determined that each District shall elect a Nominating Committee to identify candidates to the District Board of Directors and International Director. This is part of an important effort to establish what is referred to as "Good Governance" within Sons of Norway. The banking and insurance calamities of the last decade or two have forced this issue upon all financial institutions by way of new laws, rules, and regulations. Sons of Norway is a \$350,000,000 financial services company which is applying "Good Governance" to its policies and procedures. Refer to the Sons of Norway Charter and Constitutions Paragraphs 3.7.7, 2.11.4.1, and 3.11.5.1.

The Nominating Committee's responsibility is to identify, review, and recommend eligible candidates for the office of International Director, District Lodge Five Executive Officers, and Zone Directors. All candidates must be Benefit Members, which means they must own one of the Society's benefit products. The term of District officers and Directors is two years. The International Director serves a four year term. All candidates must complete the Candidate Application form.

We are confident that District Five has qualified members throughout the Six Zones who would be good candidates for the executive and director positions; but we need to identify those members, provide them with the answers they may have about the responsibilities of the offices, and encourage them to complete the Candidate Application Form. This is where you as officers and leaders play an important role in the health and welfare of your local lodge, District Five, and Sons of Norway as a whole.

All District Five local lodges will be electing delegates in January or February of 2016 to attend the District Five Lodge Meeting in Marshfield, WI, June 22-26, 2016. Please take responsibility, or ask your successor to do so, for sharing this letter with your local lodge as soon as possible. We depend on you to be the voice of Sons of Norway, and this is a very important issue. If your lodge can identify qualified candidates, encourage them to accept election as delegates to the 2016 District Lodge Meeting, and provide their names to the District Five Nominating Committee. ### A reminder on Wisconsin Regional Ski for Light Event

On Thursday, October 22, 2015 the WI Regional Ski for Light leadership committee met in Madison. The annual Ski for Light event scheduled for last February at the Rosholt Lion's Camp had been cancelled for two reasons –lack of snow and not enough registered participants.

Mike Graper, the ski instructor, shared comments about past events and his vision for the future. He reported difficulties experienced in scheduling guides for the vision impaired skiers when the event is a "maybe" and when participants don't really want to ski but merely have a weekend get-a-way. Mike said a resort in southeastern Wisconsin will be offering this type of guided skiing this coming ski season.

After much discussion, the committee voted to cancel the event scheduled for February 2016. Members of the committee will be gathering information about other types of events that could be offered to the blind community. The committee will meet in 2016 to reassess future events.
