
Not getting the Viking e-Post?

Since 1973, Hayward, WI has hosted the American Birkebeiner Ski Race, the granddaddy of all cross country events in America. Over the course of time, different sponsors have been involved, including the Sons of Norway International. Not seen as a profitable venture, the Sons of Norway discontinued its relationship with the event, but the 5th District of the Sons of Norway stepped forward to continue a time-loved tradition of providing cookies for the Barnebirke, the children's ski race, which is held on Thursday of *Birkie Week*, in 2017, February 23rd.

Partnered with Swiss Miss, children and their families enjoy a wonderful cup of hot chocolate and a cookie or two provided by our generous members. Remaining cookies are taken to Hayward High School where the elite skiers gather to pick up their bibs, timing devices, and other supplies. The adults I have met are also thankful for our efforts and some have said, "This is the best part of the Birkebeiner for me!" Coffee is also sold at the high school, contributing some additional funding to the District 5 treasury.

Cookies come to the Barnebirke from lodges throughout District 5 and from as far away as lodges in Indiana via District 5 President Andrew Johnsen. Our cookie goal is 1,000 dozen of cookies, but that total was lacking last year. Some lodges sent a monetary donation, instead of cookies, if their numbers are few or their members unable to help with this project. Before set out, the cookies are counted by the Recreation Director, and a proper report can be made.

Cookies from Southern Wisconsin are gathered and taken to the Barnebirke by members from Idun and Vennelag Lodges. There are a few things to keep in mind when preparing cookies for the event. Please do not use nuts or peanut butter in your cookies, due to allergic reactions some children have today. The serious skiers prefer wholesome cookies made from grains such as oatmeal. Spice cookies are a hit, as are the old-fashioned molasses cookies. Traditional varieties are also enjoyed such as chocolate chip and sugar cookies

I hope that your lodge will be able to assist with our cookie collection this year! If you have further questions about this heartwarming event, don't hesitate to contact me.

Christmas in Norge, God Jul!

- Norwegian homes have trees decorated with julekurver-woven heart baskets and streamers of Norwegian flags.
- ▲ Gifts are exchanged on Christmas Eve.
- Children believe the Julenissen (Santa) or another helpful nisse delivers the gifts.
- A sheaf of wheat called a julenek is often left outside for the birds to eat.
- A Rice porridge is left for the nisse whose job it is to guard the farm animals.
- Candles are lit on Christmas Eve and can be seen burning until New Year's Day.
- A Christmas celebrations began in Norway between the years of 1000 to 1100 AD when Christianity arrived in Norway.
- Previously homage was paid to the old Scandinavian gods. The people celebrated jul in the middle of winter-a celebration of the past harvest and a time to look forward to spring.
- Much juleøl (beer) was brewed and enjoyed. Nisseøl is made at home, most often sans alcohol.
- Each year a huge Norwegian pine is sent to the UK to honor the British for their help during WWII. The tree stands in London at Trafalgar Square.
- One baking tradition is to make "sju slag" seven different types of cakes.
- A special rice porridge (risgrøtkrem) is eaten on Christmas Eve either as a meal at lunchtime or at dinner. The person who finds a whole almond in the porridge wins a special prize-a pink or white marzipan pig! SOURCE: WhyChristmas.com

King Olav V Scholarship

King Olav V of Norway gave his permission to the Sons of Norway Foundation to use his name in establishing a fund to be known as the "King Olav V Norwegian-American Heritage Fund." Its purpose is to fund activities in which the American and Norwegian heritages are explored, studied and shared by qualified scholarship recipients. Endowment money has been raised by selling medallions and securing gifts from Sons of Norway members.

Oslo International Summer School

The Sons of Norway Foundation offers two scholarships to Oslo International Summer School annually. Each of the two scholarships is for \$1,500. The Sons of Norway Foundation general fund supports this scholarship through donations from our generous members, lodges and friends.

Helen Tronvold Norwegian Folk High School Scholarship

The Sons of Norway Foundation Helen Tronvold Norwegian Folk High School Scholarship, established in 2005, supports the Sons of Norway Foundation's objective of providing cross-cultural experiences for youth. Helen Tronvold remembered Sons of Norway youth with a special bequest in her will that is a major source of funding for this scholarship. Sons of Norway members also donate to the fund to help it grow.

Lund Fund Scholarship

The Sons of Norway International Board of Directors established the Lund Fund of the Sons of Norway Foundation in 2010 as a tribute to former Chief Executive Officer, John Lund and former Legal Counsel of Sons of Norway, Allan Lund, for their combined forty years of outstanding service and dedication. The Lund family has chosen to use this scholarship fund for study abroad experiences through accredited, post high school, educational institutions. No preference shall be given based on the country selected for the study abroad experience. Special consideration shall be given to military veterans.

Warne-Eng Scholarship

The Douglas Warne – Rolf & Wenche Eng Scholarship creates an opportunity for qualified applicants to attend educational institutions in Norway and assists with the costs of tuition, room and board. This scholarship is endowed and funded by Douglas Warne in honor and remembrance of his experiences at the University of Oslo, International Summer School and the friendship and assistance provided by the Rotary and the Rolf and Wenche Eng family during that school year and subsequent visits to Norway. Both affected his choices in life and in his profession. In 2013, Mr. Warne marked being active in his local Scandinavian Community for more than 50 years. He is past president of the Norwegian Commercial Club, Leif Erikson Lodge of the Sons of Norway, secretary of Leif Erikson Recreation Board and a member of the Board of Governors of the Sons of Norway Foundation.
