

Nancy Lorraine Jensen Memorial Scholarship Fund*

Annual deadline April 1

Dr. and Mrs. Arthur S. Jensen established this fund in memory of their remarkable daughter, Nancy Lorraine Jensen, an aerospace engineer/chemist at NASA, who died unexpectedly at age 35.

Eligibility:

- This scholarship is open to American citizens, women ages 17-35. Applicant, parent or grandparent must have three consecutive years of membership prior to applying.
- Applicant must be a full-time undergraduate who has completed at least one term of studies and been accepted as a major in chemistry, physics, or in chemical, electrical or mechanical engineering.
- Applicant attained an SAT score of at least 1800, a math score of at least 600, or an ACT score of at least 26.
- Scholarship award is for 50% of the tuition of one semester for up to three years.

Warne - Eng Scholarship*

Annual deadline April 1

This scholarship is endowed and funded by Douglas Warne in honor and remembrance of his experiences at the University of Oslo, International Summer School and the friendship and assistance provided by Rotary through the Rolf and Wenche Eng family during that school year and subsequent visit to Norway.

The Warne-Eng Scholarship creates an opportunity for qualified applicants to attend educational institutions in Norway and assists with the major costs of tuition, room and board.

Eligibility:

- Applicant must be accepted to study at an accredited, post high school setting in Norway, (including, but not limited to, folk and craft schools, Oslo University International Summer School and other colleges in Norway, music, theatre and technical schools).
- Any current American or Canadian members of the Sons of Norway or Rotary, as well as their children or grandchildren, are eligible to apply.
- Applicant must be willing to share their experiences with Sons of Norway or Rotary groups upon return to the USA.
- Applicants of any age who have completed one full year of college level work, and have been accepted by an educational institution in Norway for undergraduate work, are eligible.
