Lodge Program Committee- by Mike Palecek

One of biggest takeaways from the 2019 District Leadership Conference was to have a lodge program committee. Roberta (Happy) Youngs, a lodge vice president, presented this idea. She first got involved in her lodge by being one of five members on the lodge program committee. The next year, she was chairperson of that committee and their representative on the lodge board. Next year, she became lodge vice president and recruited members to this committee.

Happy explained this initiative, saying "this committee decides what our monthly programs will be for the next year. They split up the duties of finding presenters and communicating with them. Most members selected to the program committee have been members for two to five years, so they understand the format of our monthly programs, but are considered somewhat 'newcomers.' Because many lodge members look at the monthly meetings and its program to be the one of the most important parts of the lodge, the program committee is empowered to keep our programs fresh and different, as well as to decide which programs from the past should be revisited again.

"One of the new meeting programs introduced this year was a presentation by a local birding expert. Although it was somewhat Nordic themed, because it focused on birds in Wisconsin during the winter, it appealed to non-Scandinavian spouses more than many of our programs do. The next month's program was on rosemaling, so we do try to stay close to our heritage, too.

"In the early summer, the lodge president and I get together, look at the lodge roster, and discuss who might be good members to recruit for the committee. Only one of the five members from the past committee are invited back, so there is some institutional knowledge on the committee. The rest haven't served before, but are active members. It is my job to recruit members for this committee, but people rarely refuse.

"The lodge program committee usually has their organization meeting in July or August, to brainstorm about different programming ideas. I give them guidance about certain things which they need to consider, such as when we have a foundation night, lodge elections or a visit from our Financial Benefit Counselor or zone director, where we might need an abbreviated program. They can spend \$50 for a speaker stipend without lodge board approval.

"The program committee members take turns on which months they are arranging the program, so it is usually just two months each person needs to make arrangements for. Sometimes a couple committee members work on a monthly program together. They only have a couple more group meetings. One member of the committee attends the monthly lodge board meeting, to keep the board informed of their progress and what is scheduled. This year, several members of the committee are taking turns coming to board meetings. Last year, the committee chairperson attended board meetings. By having someone on the committee on the board, we can easily coordinate their work into the lodge calendar and better promote our lodge programs. This attendee to our board meeting gets to see how their committee fits into the bigger picture.

"Our lodge president calls this committee our lodge's leadership farm club. It is a baseball term for developing big league baseball players. He makes sure they are recognized for their program work at the monthly meeting that they have organized. By the end of their one-year term, many of these committee members are recruited to serve our lodge in other ways. In this way, we are always keeping our lodge board of directors fresh and active."

Getting ready for District 5 Convention and Lodge Meeting!

Delegate Election Numbers- This information (plus other documents) will be sent to your lodge president and secretary. This is to give you a heads up for lodges meeting this next week and for planning purposes! If I get the updated president and secretary list by Friday, they will be sent to the new president and secretary. If not, they will go to the 2019 listing and any transitions should pass it along! That is why it's also going into the FFFN!

Idun Lodge 5-74 in Madison, WI is hosting the District 5 Sons of Norway Convention and Lodge Meeting on June 24-28, 2020 at the Radisson Hotel Madison, 517 Grand Canyon Drive, Madison, WI 53719.

The Sons of Norway District 5 By-Laws, Article 111, Paragraph 2 states: Every local lodge in the District shall be entitled to two representatives for the lodge, and one representative for every 100 members or major fraction thereof, based on the last Semi-Annual Report prior to the election of delegates. All members in good standing are eligible representatives.

Delegates should be elected using the formula above based on December 31, 2019 membership figures. You should also elect a corresponding number of alternates, on a priority basis, that will serve should any of your delegates be unable to attend.

These elections must take place in the months of January and February 20. Each lodge president and secretary is receiving a <u>Report of Election</u> included with this letter, <u>which is to be completed and returned to the District Secretary immediately following the election</u>. (Sons of Norway Constitution reads: "The Secretary of the Local Lodge shall prepare a report of election giving names and addresses of the duly elected Delegates and Alternates.

This report shall be signed by the Local Lodge President and Local Lodge Secretary and forwarded to the District Secretary no later than five days after the election.") Please be sure the names are written plainly and spelled correctly!

I am asking that you include their membership number, address, city, state, zip, phone and email address on the form and return it to me postmarked no later than March 5, 2020.

Consider being a delegate to the 2020 District 5 Lodge Meeting and Convention!

Something to share with your members as you recruit delegate candidates!

All across District 5, elections will be held in January and February as lodges elect their delegates and alternates for the District 5 convention. Some of your members may be sharing their experiences as delegates at your meetings so members are more aware of what happens at conventions, what their role is, and the experience they have had. To help new members and those without convention experience, here are some things to consider and share with your membership:

Who can be a delegate or alternate?

- You do NOT have to be a benefit member to serve as a delegate to the District Convention.
- Current District 5 Board members cannot serve as delegates for their local lodges.

Time Requirements

- The District 5 Convention is June 24-28, 2020 in Madison, Wisconsin.
- Your delegates may be asked by the District President to serve on a committee. This would require them to attend committee meetings on the Thursday morning and afternoon (or until committee work is done and the committee is dismissed).
- The opening ceremonies will be on Friday morning. The first official business and seating of the delegates is also Friday morning and all delegates need to be in all sessions
 Friday and Saturday.
- As times and schedules are finalized, watch the District 5 website (<u>www.sonsofnorway5.com</u>)
 and future mailings for schedules and timelines.

What does a delegate do?

- Represents and speaks on behalf of your lodge on District business, resolutions, proposed changes
- Accepts your lodge's recognition and awards
- Attends all delegate sessions, zone meeting (Saturday noon) and votes on behalf of your lodge
- May serve on a committee if asked to by the District President
- A delegate is the only member (along with current District 5 Board Members) that can run for the District Board (<u>if a benefit member</u> or if they purchase a benefit product at the convention).
- A delegate can run for a delegate spot for the International Convention (August 16-23) in Ringsaker, Norway, <u>if they are a benefit member</u> or if they purchase a benefit product at the convention.
- Learn about Sons of Norway by attending workshops, visiting displays and visiting with other members
- Bring back many ideas, activities and enthusiasm that will benefit your lodge
- Report to your lodge about what they learned, business conducted and report on elections held at the convention
- Have a wonderful time and go home ready to carry out the mission of Sons of Norway!

What is a Benefit Member? Someone who owns a Sons of Norway insurance certificate.

How do you pay for delegates? Each lodge handles this differently. Many will help the delegates with convention costs, registration, travel and hotel costs in varying amounts, paying it in full, or a portion. Some lodges will have a special fundraiser or event to raise money for delegate expenses.

Thank you for electing delegates and alternates and your consideration to serve as one! If you have further questions, contact your lodge president, zone officer or a District Board member!
