I had some email issues when I sent it out (late) yesterday so I'm not sure it went to all the email addresses. Thank you! All Officer Election Report forms are in! Updates in red!!

A huge thank you to all of you for sending in or doing your online report by the deadline. For those that I worked with the past week, a huge thank you for your follow-up, calls and help! It is greatly appreciated. All of District 5 is in but as of today, she's waiting on 50 lodges from other Districts to report- uff da!

Now what? This is a multi-stage process in getting all the online lists and the complete directory done. From what I understand:

- 1. Now that all hard copy and online reports are in from our District, Sherry Gorse needs to enter any of the hard copy and phone/email updates that you sent rather than updating online. She is doing this for all 8 Districts so it takes time.
- 2. All of District 5 is in so I believe she rolled over the new officers for District 5 yesterday! As soon as that is done, she "rolls over 2019" on the website listings. Until then, you will still see the 2018 officers listed.
- 3. She is waiting for 50 other lodges to submit their forms- uff da! So she thought it will be next week before I get the new lists! Once that is done, then she will send out the complete District Lodge Officer list and meeting locations to the 8 District Secretaries. That is what I use to make our lodge directory!
- 4. This FFFN is being sent to the database I have for 2018. If you have new officers, simply forward it to them until I notify you that I'm switching to the 2019 list!

So in the meantime, if you have any officers that haven't updated their profiles (address, email, phone), have them do that! If your meeting place has changed in the past year, update that. This way when Sherry rolls out the data and sends us the files, they will be current!

I hope that we can get the lists from Sherry in the next ten days (but I see it is listed as February 1 on the calendar deadline provided by SN International) and then I need 1-2 days to finalize the directory. It will be sent to local lodge presidents and secretaries!

More updates on Barnebirkie from Cheryl Schlesser

Joe and Eileen Timmerman, the crew chiefs for the Barnebirkie (ski race for children in Hayward, WI), are thinking of new approaches to making the "Barne" a bit more festive for the children. With that said, their idea is to try to encourage costumed individuals who are willing to meet young skiers and their families near the start area 30-45 minutes prior to the race. Once the race begins, the costumed characters will walk with the Bitty Barne kids (smallest children) to the finish.

They have commitments from volunteers who will dress as Mr. & Mrs. Claus and The Easter Bunny, a bobcat, and a lumberjack. They are hoping that Smokey the Bear and other mascots will join in the

fun! The official mascots of the American Birkebeiner (Inga and the warriors who carried Prince Haakon to safety hundreds of years ago) have been asked to join us at the start.

I would like to ask members of the 5th District to help, as well! Do you have access to a Viking costume or one from Norse mythology such as Thor, Loki, Freya? Characters from the movie, *Frozen*: Olaf, Anna, Elsa, Sven the reindeer, Hans, or Kristoff would also be welcomed by the children. Could you loan the Timmermans such a costume or another for the Barnebirkie? The Timmermans will find a person to wear it. I am working to secure the troll costume from my local Chamber's office.

I have suggested to the Timmermans that they contact the University of Wisconsin to determine the cost of using Bucky Badger's services for the event. There may be other mascots available for use, too, and I ask that you communicate the names of such mascots and their contact information to Eileen or Joe directly. Perhaps you belong to another group that has costumes and/or people who would be willing to assist in this venture (clowns, cows, lumberjacks, patriotic)

Joe and Eileen (Bean) will be using the registration records for this year's Birkebeiner to determine whether there are any international skiers who could help at the Barnie start. This will be determined by their arrival in Hayward.

Better yet, if you would like to assist us with the Barnebirkie, we would welcome you with open arms! Lodging is currently available, but do not delay in securing it. This cost is not covered by the 5th District. The Barnebirkie is scheduled for Thursday, February 21st, beginning at 11:30 AM. The NEW start location this year is behind Hayward Primary and Intermediate Schools. This race is a noncompetitive race for children. The goal is to promote the Nordic lifestyle and welcome young skiers to the sport of cross country skiing. Parking is available on the streets nearby and possibly in the former Armory site parking lot. Plan ahead to secure your parking location. Hundreds of young skiers usually participate!

Please contact me if you can be of further service to the District. I will be leaving for Hayward on Wednesday, February 20th or sooner if inclement weather is forecast. The 5th District provides a wonderful lunch to all of our volunteers prepared by the women of Norse Valley and Idun Lodges following the Barnebirkie.

An organizational dinner will be held on Wednesday evening, February 20th beginning with dinner at 6:00 PM, at the Steakhouse and Lodge, 15860 T Bone Lane, Hayward, WI 54843. Credentials and identification badges will be distributed. Hopefully, the Timmermans will join us to share updates relevant to working this event.
