The Sarah L. Paulsen Memorial Scholarship Fund.

The Rules

In August 1995 eight year old Sarah Paulsen of our lodge passed away.

Because Sarah was very involved with the Sons of Norway, and was fascinated with her family's background and with Norwegian culture, friends and family, along with the Scandiana Lodge felt a scholarship established in Sarah's name would be appropriate.

The scholarship will not only carry on her love for the Norwegian Heritage, but will also enable other children to have the opportunity to attend the Sons of Norway Heritage Camp in Eau Claire, in honor of Sarah.

The scholarship will cover one quarter of the camp cost.

Parents may be concerned that getting this scholarship would prevent them from utilizing the District 5 Matching Fund Grant, but this award will have no bearing on other matching funds. This scholarship could be given in addition to District 5 and Local Lodge Matching Fund Scholarships. However, if the applicant's Local Lodge is financially unable to give their children Matching Fund Scholarships, the Sarah Paulsen Scholarship would qualify them for the District 5 Matching Fund Scholarship.

Rules:

- 1. The scholarship is open to any child age 9-15, who is interested in learning about the language and culture of Norway.
- 2. The applicant must be a heritage member or a child or grandchild of a Sons of Norway member, and belonging to a District 5 Lodge.
- 3. The applicant will write an essay of no more than 500 words. The topic is "Why I believe it is important to know about our heritage" or "Why I want to attend Norwegian Heritage Camp".
- 4. All applicants will complete a brief application form.
- 5. Applicant will include 2 letters of reference, including one from a local Lodge officer.
- 6. Applications must be postmarked by April 15. Decisions will be made by May 1, and winners will be notified by mail. Checks will be issued and mailed directly to the Scholarship Recipient before June 1.
- 7. Judges will be the Scandiana 600 Sarah L Paulsen Memorial Scholarship Fund Committee.

Masse Moro TUITION

\$1,200.00* Includes admission for one camper for the entire two-week session.

The application fee of \$100 is due upon submission and is credited towards the \$1,200.00 tuition. While the application fee is due with application, the final tuition balance can be paid at any time, and is due by **JUNE 1** of the camp year. We accept checks, money orders or cashier's checks, and online payment with a credit card or personal bank account via Paypal. ELIGIBILITY

Masse Moro is open to both boys and girls between the ages of 9-15 years old. (Campers must be 9 as of the first day of camp. No exceptions.) A two-week sleep-away camp, campers stay in cabins (furnished with bunk beds) along with 2-3 staff members and an additional 9-12 other campers. This small cozy atmosphere creates a bonded tight-knit cabin that creates a home away from home where campers feel safe and comfortable.

Not a Sons of Norway member? Not a problem. Sons of Norway membership is not a requirement to attend our camp, but one of the many great benefits of membership is tuition assistance for the Masse Moro program. The money you could potentially save in tuition for sending one child to our camp for one session would be enough to cover annual membership dues for approximately the next 5 years, so it is certainly something to be considered.

MASSE MORO ACTIVITIES & PROGRAMS

Every day campers follow a schedule, known at Masse Moro as the Timeplan. This helps keep the day at Masse Moro running smoothly. Here's a sneak peak at what happens every day at camp! We integrate Norwegian vocabulary and language into all of our activities.

DAILY SCHEDULE

FLAG RAISING: We raise and lower the Norwegian flag to mark the beginning and end of the day.

MEALS AT MASSE MORO: We serve three meals and a snack everyday. Our meals are a mix of Norwegian and American cuisine. Every meal is started and ended with a short Norwegian song.

GROUP SING-A-LONGS: Songs are a great way for kids to learn the language. Every day we meet as a camp to learn new songs and sing old favorites.

LANGUAGE CLASSES: Language classes are taught twice daily. Campers are divided into levels based on their experience and knowledge. Campers learn through games and interactive experiences.

ACTIVITY & FOLK ART CLASSES: Campers can sign-up to take 5-day and 2-day classes. Examples include: Rosemaling, baking, folk dance, sewing/knitting, mythology or runes class, Viking arts, jewelry making, woodworking, or hiking.

SPORTS: Soccer, volleyball, hiking, archery, field hockey, and handball are all celebrated sports in Norway. Campers will get to try new sports and activities.

CAMP STORE/FREE TIME: During a free period, campers are able to visit the camp store and purchase Norwegian treats, books, music, or other goods.

VIKING GAMES: Campers learn leadership, respect, and honor as they form Viking Families and learn the games of the old age. The last day of camp, campers will compete in a day long Viking Olympics.

EVENING CULTURAL & HISTORICAL PROGRAMMING: The highlight of the day is a large evening program involving the entire camp exploring various topics and issues such as Norwegian history, the whaling industry, immigration, Nordic Gods, popular Norwegian music, or learning about the Sami. After the program, everyone gathers around the campfire to reflect and discuss what was learned that day or perhaps enjoy the re-telling of a Nordic myth.

CULTURAL SKILLS PROGRAM

The Cultural Skills Program is open to all Sons of Norway members, both through their lodges or as individual participants. Your camper will be eligible to earn pins and medals as a youth member. Youth membership is FREE for children (15 and under) whose parents or grandparents are active members (active meaning a current paying member) of Sons of Norway. The Cultural Skills Program serves a variety of purposes:

- To encourage active participation in both traditional and contemporary Norwegian-North American pursuits
- To enrich the lives of members of all ages
- To provide the basis for special interest clubs within our lodges
- To provide new reasons for people to join Sons of Norway

The awards are as follows:

- Specialist: One who wishes to go in depth in one area, e.g. Hardanger embroidery or genealogy, etc
- Generalist: One who samples several skills and qualify for the basic level in each, for example: stamp collecting, crafts, and Norwegian foods.
- Mentor: One who is skilled in activities offered in the Norwegian Cultural Skills Program
 can do a different challenge: mentor others who need formal or informal instruction.
 The mentor is an extremely important person in passing on the Norwegian heritage to
 others.
- Master of Cultural Skills: One who has completed at least three levels of three different skills, or nine individual basic activities.
