Task Force Call- May 27, 2023 Notes- 19 on the call

Duane Kittleson shared that there were more changes made to the Policy & Practices/Charter at the International Board Meeting. They also approved new nominating committee guidelines but wasn't sure when that information would be out. He had proposed a motion that District Board members didn't have to be benefit members but it failed. He explained that there were 4 proposals for re-districting of the organization- lots of questions, no decisions, and a re-districting committee was formed. He feels it may take 2-4 years to do with legal issues, finances, and property ownership to consider. He shared that many want to be part of District 5 as we have been successful.

There was discussion about Insurance Professionals being able to write policies for those not living in states that are licensed. There was a reference to interstate commerce concerns that we need to follow. The group discussed increasing the awareness of SN insurance products.

Sorry, but I won't be able to be on the call Saturday, as I'll be on the road on the way to the twin cities. I've pondered over the zoning options numerous times, and see advantages and disadvantages to all. I guess my favorites were Duane's #3 and Judy's #1 and #3. With more lodges in each zone, travel miles would certainly increase for a director if the same visiting schedules were maintained. I do like the possibility of a director and alternate (assistant) for each zone, and for district officers not to have zone director responsibilities.

The group discussed how we can get more input from members and lodges:

- 1. Handouts- put the survey and the map packet on the website, if task force members want copies- Darleen will run them, and share at meetings
- 2. PowerPoint- develop a PowerPoint that task force and board members can take to lodges and give presentations. Also do a YouTube video on the task force
- 3. Talking points- have a list of talking points to help task force members make presentations.

Other discussion:

- Lodge Achievement and Family Lodge of the Year forms are currently going to the international. There may be changes that they go to the District President which would be helpful in identifying lodges who need help.
- Encourage virtual lodge meetings, zone meetings, and adding task force and board members to lodge email lists. This would help communicate to those who don't live close to a lodge or if traveling is an issue.
- The next meeting will be Saturday, August 5, at 9:00 AM CST.
- We can look at what zone directors do and what can be done electronically vs in person.
- Task force key question- do we need zones?

The was a suggestion that we form sub-committees that can work to focus on particular areas:

- 1. Population and membership- using maps and membership lists to get a geographical and membership numbers view of our District. Jim Herman had volunteered to work on maps.
- 2. Role of the Board- Board Structure- What do board members do? What can be done virtual vs. in-person? Role of the various board members and officers. Esther Charlton is interested in being on this committee.
- 3. Current ways to support lodges- what can we do in the meantime to support lodges?

Darlene will work on the handout, PowerPoint and get the information out to see who will serve on sub-committees. Ideally the sub-committees will meet during June and July in preparation for the August meeting. If anyone needs help setting up a virtual call, contact Cheryl, Darlene, Bill and Wendy, or Duane who all have virtual meeting platform accounts.
