## DISTRICT 5 LEADERSHIP - MAKING A DIFFERENCE!

## From: District 5 Nominating Committee - 2020

If you are a delegate to the District 5 convention, you are eligible to become a member of the Fifth District Board. Being on the D5 board is a way you can make an even bigger impact in the Sons of Norway. The District Five board meets *twice* a year. At these board meetings, while serving on committees, you can influence policy that will support and grow our lodges into the future. Here are a few examples of how you can make a difference: Over the years, you may have participated in bowling or fishing tournaments. This year, your lodge may be participating in a "virtual walk" back to Norway to promote fitness and interest in our shared heritage. At the district convention, you might try your hand at an optional ax throwing activity! Those sports activities are coordinated by the **D5 Sports Director**. The District Board Recreation Committee works together to keep district-wide sports activities fun and interesting. The Sports Director also spearheads district-wide sports, such as our support of the Barnebirkie youth ski event.

At the District Convention in Madison, lodges will compete to create lodge banners. This idea was first promoted for the 2018 District Convention, there were many artistic and informative creations. This was an idea spearheaded by the **D5 Publicity Director** and the D5 board Publicity committee. The D5 Publicity Director also collects your lodge's pictures and submits the best to the Viking magazine, while trying to give coverage to lodges throughout the district. This committee also works with the district webmaster, to make our website as informative and up to date as possible.

The D5 cultural committee organizes a competition of cultural items for the District Convention. This committee shares information about cultural resources with lodges and promotes Sons of Norway cultural pin programs. This committee can create cultural enrichment activities throughout the district. The **D5 Cultural Director** leads this group.

The **D5 Youth Director** works with Masse Moro camp directors and our district's Nordic Legacy Foundation to make sure D5 is offering a quality youth heritage program, which will teach the next generation about our Nordic heritage, while building self-esteem, interpersonal skills and personal achievement. The D5 Heritage and Grants committee is chaired by the D5 Youth Director. In addition to making recommendations about Masse Moro, this committee reviews scholarship applications.

#### D5 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:

The **D5 Secretary** is the key communicator to all district lodges and acts as a tremendous resource person. The secretary keeps the minutes of all district meetings and distributes these to all board members, prepares information for district meeting delegates and writes the weekly Friendly Fifth Newsletter.

The D5 board's auditing, budget-finance and fund-raising committees, work with the D5 Treasurer to insure that D5 is financially healthy. They are among the many committees which evaluates the fiscal impact of new district initiatives. These committees also provide oversight so that we are fiscally responsible which belongs to all of us in the Fifth District. The **D5 Treasurer** pays all bills, invests district funds, does accounting and files financial reports with the government and the Sons of Norway International.

Many lodges have prospective member events, as a recruiting event to keep their lodges vibrant and strong. The **D5 Vice President** oversees membership and can be a great resource to assist you in planning and executing a successful recruiting event. The D5 board Membership committee instituted the business card program, where all lodges can get business cards for recruiting purposes, and worked with the current D5 President to create a funding mechanism to help lodges pay for recruiting events, who don't have Financial Benefit Counselors (lodges in Michigan, Ohio and Tennessee). The D5 Vice President also works with the D5 President, to create an ongoing vision of the Fifth District, and performs executive duties in running the district, in the president's absence.

As leader of the Fifth District, the **D5 President** oversees new initiatives, puts together the board meeting agenda, appoints board members to specific committees, does strategic planning and works with D5 Zone Directors to help lodges be as successful as they can be. The D5 President is also called up to work with lodges who are celebrating milestone anniversaries. The D5 President also represents the Fifth District on the Presidents' Council, where all eight district presidents get together twice a year to share best practices. The D5 President also serves as an ex-officio member on every district committee. Candidates for D5 President must have served at least one full term on the D5 board.

#### ZONE DIRECTORS:

Your lodge belongs to one of six geographic zones in the Fifth District. Each zone is represented by two zone directors. All the directors and executive committee members also serve as zone directors, except for the D5 Secretary and Treasurer, who are at-large members.

Zone directors are assigned lodges to assist. Lodges often call upon zone directors to annually install their officers. Lodges sometimes ask zone directors to do a program at a lodge meeting on a heritage topic which they are an expert on. Your zone director can come to special events or recruitment activities to lend a hand. Zone directors are also called upon when lodges have challenges where they want an outside Sons of Norway expert to give them some assistance and guidance. Your zone director is here to help you, to be a resource; all you must do is ask. Zone directors visit each lodge they are assigned, at least twice a year. Zone directors also run plan and conduct a zone seminar at least annually.

All board members serve by attending two district board meetings yearly, in spring and fall. There they serve on committees, appointed by the D5 President. They also attend the D5 convention every two years, not as representatives of their lodge, but as D5 board members. Their lodging, meals and transportation costs while on D5 business are reimbursed. There is also an annual compensation of \$500 each for the D5 President and Treasurer, and \$1500 for the D5 Secretary, for their extra work.

#### BENEFITS OF BEING ON THE DISTRICT BOARD:

When you serve on the district board, you are interacting with some of the top leaders in the Sons of Norway. This networking is invaluable, in getting ideas you can take home to make your lodge even better. Over the past four years, the Fifth District has offered Leadership Conferences, which D5 board members have contributed to, and honed their leadership skills. You get a deep understanding of what resources are available in the Fifth District.

You are empowered to make Sons of Norway even better for your lodge and everyone else in the Fifth District. It is highly satisfying to make important contributions to the promotion of our shared Nordic heritage, and by being on the district board, you can truly make a difference.

You can more easily network with all the great lodge officers and members you are working with and throughout the Fifth District.

#### QUALIFICATION NOTES:

To be a member of the district board, you must meet these qualifications:

- Be a currently registered member of the Fifth District
- Be a delegate to the D5 district meeting and be present at the meeting
- Fill out and submit the D5 leadership application, **DEADLINE: May 24, 2020**
- Own a Sons of Norway financial product, by the end of the D5 district meeting
- Be willing to serve (2 two- or three-day meetings yearly, attend the Sunday D5 district meeting board meeting, visit lodges, perform duties for your position)
- If you are applying for a position on the D5 Executive Committee, be willing to have a background check done on you as part of the vetting process.

You can also choose to run as an "Alternate" to any of these positions (except D5 President). The alternate would serve if the person who was holding the position is unable, either on a temporary or permanent basis. The D5 Vice President serves as the alternate to the D5 President.

#### **INTERNATIONAL LODGE NOMINEE:**

District 5 submits two names to the International meeting, as our nominee for International Delegate and International Delegate-Alternate. This nominee and alternate are voted on at the D5 meeting. The International Lodge votes on all district delegates to the International Board. If you are interested in being considered for these positions, you need to fill out the International Sons of Norway leadership application, **DEADLINE: May 24, 2020**, and be vetted with an extensive background check.
