Many unknowns and unanswered questions right now

We are living in unprecedented times and appreciate everyone's concerns, questions and needs during this time. There are many more questions than answers right now and I will try to summarize what I know, what we are working on, and what we don't know.

- 1. The District Board meeting scheduled for April 3-4 will not be held in person. We have a board conference call on March 19 to discuss the logistics but we will likely do committee work in March and have a conference call on Saturday, April 4.
- 2. There was a conference call on March 18 for District Presidents, District Convention Chairs and some International Board and Staff to discuss District Conventions and the International Convention. I was not on that call and don't know what all was discussed or determined.
- 3. Idun Lodge has been addressing their questions with the Board and the hotel in the event that the June 25-28 District Convention must be postponed, cancelled or re-scheduled.
- 4. I just got the notes from Idun's planning meeting on March 15. They did not indicate when the registration information would be available. I still have a few more lodges to report and then will have the final delegate lists that I can give to them, District President for committee selection, and to the nominating committee.
- 5. District Youth Director has been in communication with Beaver Creek Reserve and the Board about the status of Masse Moro for 2020. No decisions yet.
- 6. I have seen MANY lodges cancel all events for March, many for April and we all are struggling with what to plan.
- 7. Syttende Mai- Stoughton Chamber sent out information that they are cautiously proceeding to plan. I see Westby has been posting information on their event and it looks like they are proceeding.
- 8. If you have gotten a grant for activities this spring that have been canceled or might be, check with the granting source (i.e. Sons of Norway Foundation or wherever) on how they are handling them.

What I personally know:

- 1. We need to be following the restrictions, advisories and other information provided by our local, state and federal government. This changes daily and it's critical to be aware of what is happening.
- 2. The board is meeting via conference call tonight to discuss many of these issues and to solidify how our meeting will be conducted on April 4.
- 3. I, along with many leaders, are looking at the Constitution/Bylaws for our local lodges, District and International to see what guidelines we have there.
- 4. Safety and following the mandatory restrictions of social distance, number who can be in groups, serving food guidelines and closure of restaurants, and so on.
- 5. Personal safety of our members is critical. Many of us are still working and have no idea who we are exposed to and who they were exposed to. We may then be exposing others to these unknowns. My personal feeling is to limit my exposure to anyone so all our Mandt Lodge

- events have been canceled and we will likely have a conference call for our business meeting in April and likely cancel all April activities at this time. It's not worth exposing our members, many in the age range or compromised health range, that we are to be careful with.
- 6. We have all spent more time canceling and "undoing" events and activities. Please take time to look at any contracts, rental agreements, travel agreements and contracts if your lodge was planning trips, and other obligations your lodge has.
- 7. There are many types of free conference call and other online, virtual services out there to use in the immediate time period when we aren't to be meeting in groups. I'm not an expert in them but the District has been using FreeConferenceCalls (Mike Palecek would be a good resource on this service). I use ZOOM meetings (free for 100 people or less and limit of 40 minute calls/meetings) for work and will likely use that for Mandt. ZOOM also has paid subscriptions for larger groups and longer periods of time.

From International

Amid growing concerns over the COVID-19/coronavirus, we want to let you know that we recognize the seriousness of the situation and we understand that this is a stressful and difficult time for many of you.

To protect our employees and mitigate potential spread of the virus, we are implementing social distancing recommendations from the CDC, including having minimal staff onsite and equipping our employees to work from home. We appreciate your patience as we work to make these changes.

Your wellbeing is of the utmost importance to us, and we encourage you to make your health and wellbeing a top priority as we continue to navigate these challenging circumstances together.

The following guidelines are recommended by public health officials to help you stay healthy and protect those around you.

Clean your hands often

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.

Avoid close contact

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Put distance between yourself and other people if COVID-19 is spreading in your community. This is especially important for people who are at higher risk of getting very sick.

Stay home if you're sick

Stay home if you are sick, except to get medical care.

Cover coughs and sneezes

- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze, or use the inside of your elbow.
- Throw used tissues in the trash.
- Immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not readily available, clean your hands with a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.

Thank you for your doing all you can to keep our community healthy! We will continue to monitor the situation closely and will send further updates as necessary.

- Keep up with your lodge's legal, financial and other filings. Remember 990s are due May 15.

- I've seen some cute online postings of people sitting outside someone's window (one outside and one inside) and them talking on the phone. They aren't in physical contact but they can see and hear each other! I know there's lots of things out there like that!
