Photo Guidelines - Whether submitting a photo to be used in Viking magazine, or for publication in a local newspaper, there are a few simple guidelines to follow.

First, always send a glossy, traditional film print, or high resolution (300dpi) color photo. These reproduce the best in most instances.

The ideal photo is one that can stand alone, telling a story and needing only a brief caption to accompany it.

There should be no more than five subjects in any one photo.

Always include a typewritten photo caption that identifies all the people in the photo.

Names should go in the order of left to right, or clockwise.

Never write on the photo itself.

Also, never staple the photo to its caption or a release. Instead, use a paperclip so as not to damage the photo.

## Fly your Norwegian colors and support the SON District 5 Nordic Legacy Foundation!

When Norway became a sovereign nation in 1821, the Storting adopted a flag with the Nordic cross, similar to other Scandinavian countries. In the early 1800's, some countries were forming republics to better represent its citizens, and the red-white-blue of France and the United States flags influenced Norwegian flag creator Fredrik Meltzer to include those colors in the flag design. At the end of WW II, Norwegians flew national flag banned by the Nazis as a celebration. According to the Norwegian flag law of 1898 (updated in 1927) the Norwegian Flag is raised at 8 AM, between March and October, and at 9 AM in winter months. The flag is lowered at sunset, but no later than 11 PM during the "midnight sun" times. In the far north parts of Norway, in the winter, the flag is only flown between 10 AM and 3 PM.

The Norwegian flag is flown on these holidays:

- Jan. 1 New Year's Day
- Jan. 21 Princess Ingrid Alexandra's birthday
- Feb. 6 Sami National Day Feb. 21 King Harald V's birthday
- Faster
- May 1 Labor Day
- May 8 Liberation Day
- May 17 Constitution Day Whitsunday (8th Sunday after Easter)
- June 7 Union Dissolution Day
- July 4 Queen Sonja's birthday
- July 20 Crown Prince Haakon Magnus' birthday
- July 29 Olsok (in memory of King Olav Haraldsson)
- Aug. 19 Crown Princess Mette-Marit's birthday
- Sept 2nd Monday (every 4 years) General Election
- Dec. 25 Christmas


### <u>D63 – Officer Election Report- You must submit it whether it's an election year</u> for your lodge or not!
