Zone Alignment Committee Report from the District 5 October Board Meeting

The zoning issue is more than a mileage and logistics issue. Darlene had prepared a map of where lodges are located and there are geographic concerns as well as the number of lodges each board member is responsible for. The committee discussed the current relationship between the District and lodges, zone directors and lodges, and feedback zone directors get or don't get. There is concern about lodges that are discussing disbanding and their disconnect to the District. There is frustration by the zone directors that solicit responses but don't get any feedback as well as lodges that express frustration in not being contacted by zone directors.

Some options to consider and get feedback on from lodges (and other suggestions!)

- 1. Involve the alternates- in each zone you would have four people available for lodge support but just the two that would be official board members.
- 2. Restructure the board- Have a 14 person board electing a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Publicity Director, Youth Director, Sports Director, and Cultural Director along with one at-large representative from each state: Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Tennessee and Ohio.
- 3. Add a third director to Zone 6.
- 4. Keep the current zone structure but focus on better board training so the outreach could be made by the board members that would improve the relationship with the lodges.
- 5. Address the disconnect that lodges have with the District- not feeling a part of the District, increase attendance at the District Lodge Meeting (14 lodges didn't attend in 2014), completion of required reports and activities, and other areas that need improvement.

If any major changes are proposed, how will this affect the 2016 convention? Specific areas would include the nominating committee's work, the sequence of making zone changes and then board elections, the process of electing delegates to the International Convention, and the financial impact of any changes. **The committee recommends that these options be presented to lodges encouraging feedback and other ideas.** The board can then make a specific proposal at the spring 2016 board meeting that would be a bylaw change for the District Lodge Meeting.

On Thursday, October 22, 2015 the WI Regional Ski for Light leadership committee met in Madison. The annual Ski for Light event scheduled for last February at the Rosholt Lion's Camp had been cancelled for two reasons –lack of snow and not enough registered participants.

Mike Graper, the ski instructor, shared comments about past events and his vision for the future. He reported difficulties experienced in scheduling guides for the vision impaired skiers when the event is a "*maybe*" and when participants don't really want to ski but merely have a weekend get-a-way. Mike said a resort in southeastern Wisconsin will be offering this type of guided skiing this coming ski season.

After much discussion, the committee voted to cancel the event scheduled for February 2016. Members of the committee will be gathering information about other types of events that could be offered to the blind community. The committee will meet in 2016 to reassess future events. *Reported by Duane Kittleson, a WIRSFL committee member.*
