

Happy Foundation Month from District Foundation Director Darlene Arneson



Engaging New Members in Your Lodge Cheryl Wille-Schlesser District 5 Vice President rogrcher@mhtc.net

- As soon as you learn about a new member's registration, send them a welcome letter
 providing basic information about your lodge. Place a personal phone call to the new
 member and offer to answer any questions they may have. Include the date of your next
 meeting or event.
- It is not necessary for new members to participate fully! Sometimes, it is better for a new member to observe an event or to view lodge procedures to gain a more complete perspective and an understanding of how your lodge operates.
- Provide nametags for your entire lodge, so the new person can blend in among all others.
- Set aside a "game night" on your lodge calendar when members are not working or listening, but rather are enjoying fellowship together.
- Organize a potluck meal to begin a meeting so members have a chance to share recipes and simply converse.
- Play a "getting to know you" game at one of your meetings and learn something amazing!
- Introduce your new members at a Lodge meeting and add their "bio" to an upcoming newsletter.
- Share good news from your member families.
- Recognize those families with new births to report and those who have a birthday or anniversary celebration.
- Assign a lodge mentor who can answer questions or provide feedback.
- Organize a new member breakfast which gives your officers the opportunity to share information about your lodge. Explain how a new member can make a difference in your community through service projects.
- Ask your new member to participate in your Adopt-a-School Program or another project working with youth.
- Schedule a social gathering that allows members to converse with one another:

- Plan an outing such as a trip to: Door County, Høstfest, the Viking Ship, or Vesterheim Norwegian American Museum in Decorah, IA, or ultimately a trip to Norway.
- Find a restaurant close to you and enjoy lunch or dinner together.
- > Travel to MECCA-The new International Office of the Sons of Norway! Explore the sites of Minneapolis and St. Paul.
- Attend a holiday concert or play together.
- Adopt a project such as highway or bike trail clean-up.
- Form a competitive Kubb Club.
- Encourage student exchanges between your city and one in Norway.
- Invite culture experts to teach a class locally in your lodge.
- Participate in a local Syttende Mai parade or celebration of cultures.
- Celebrate Nordic holidays: Constitution Day-May 17th, Midsummer, Leif Erikson Day, Christmas, St. Stephen's Day
- Determine the reason the new member joined Sons of Norway. If it is genealogy, connect them
 with resources to continue their search. Ask a local specialist to speak with your lodge. In
 Southern Wisconsin, the Norwegian American Genealogical Center and Naeseth Library is
 close by. They also provide on-line services and hourly services to members www.nagcnl.org.
 Their executive Director, Dana Kelly can also provide a virtual presentation for a lodge
 meeting.
- Station greeters at the entry to your meeting area. Record the names of the visitors and share these with the Lodge President so the guests can be welcomed.
- Encourage your veteran members to intermingle with the new members. A welcoming friendly atmosphere will reap rewards, and the word will spread that coming to a meeting is enjoyable.
- Focus on new members as their renewal month approaches and reinforce why their membership is important.

For Lodge Secretaries or others filling out the D63 Officer Updates for 2021

Your lodge's Officer Roster for 2021 should be reported online via a current lodge officer's profile page on www.sofn.com. These changes are typically registered by the Lodge Secretary. Please indicate your 2021 officers even if there have been no changes.

To notify Sons of Norway Headquarters of your 2021 officers:

- Sign on with your username and password to www.sonsofnorway.com.
- As a lodge officer, you will immediately land on your Profile Page.
- Click 'Lodge Officer Updates' from the menu to the left of your name.
- Need to change your meeting place or times? Click the gray 'Change Meeting Information' button, enter your changes and then select 'Save'. Your changes will be recorded, but won't be reflected on the website until 1/15/2021.
- To register your 2021 Officer Roster, click on the light gray 'Officers' button.
 - No changes? Click the gray 'No Changes for Upcoming Year' button at the top of the page.
 - Adding a completely new officer position in 2021? Click 'Add a new position' and then enter the title and member number of the person filling the office. Hit Submit. Then hit 'Save the Changes'.
 - To indicate the change in officer, delete the member number of the 2020 officer in a position and type in the member number of the 2021 officer. The names will NOT change on the screen at this point.
 - If your lodge will no longer have a certain position in 2021, click the 'Remove this position' button for that entry.
 - Once you have made ALL your changes, click the 'SUBMIT CHANGES' button at the bottom of the page.
 - You will see a list of your changes. If they are correct, click 'Save the Changes'.
 - Your 2021 roster of offices has been recorded! Any changes will not be live on the website until 1/15/2021.

Even though not all lodges will be holding elections this November due to social distancing restrictions, all lodges should affirm or change their lodge officer rosters by 12/31/2020.

There will be no paper D63 Lodge Officer update forms mailed out this year.

Sports and Recreation Update from former director Cheryl Wille-Schlesser



In preparation for the fall District 5 Board meeting, the Sports and Recreation Committee recently reviewed the guidelines in place for the *Virtual Walk to Norway* which was organized in recognition of the 125th Anniversary of the Sons of Norway.

I am aware of eight participating lodges. I ask that lodge presidents or their sports and recreation directors submit pictures of their members who are exercising. Due to the cancellation of the 2020 Convention, the Power Point slide show of this activity will now be placed on the District 5 webpage. I will begin working on that document soon, but some lodges have not sent the list of participants nor the photos of members exercising.

District 5 Lodge Presidents or the lodge's sports and recreation director are reminded to share the number of miles their lodge has exercised to date. I will share this information as it arrives. The District 5 website will reflect the accomplishments of each participating lodge.

As the challenge draws to a close, I will prepare participation certificates for lodge members, and these will be forwarded to D5 Lodge Presidents for distribution. The names of participants along with the names of participating lodges will be posted on the District 5 webpage. There is plenty of time for your lodge members to complete this challenge before December 15, 2020. Go for it! It is a pandemic-safe activity, and your members' stamina will improve while participating.

Checks of support should be directed to District 5 Treasurer Mike Palecek by December 31, 2020. The \$50.00 entry fee per Lodge will be deposited in the Masse Moro account for use with the next session of campers.

It would be great to know how many members have earned sports medals during this challenge. Feel free to send that information when your lodge completes the challenge. All components of this challenge will be finalized in December 2020.
