

Last week's "Nordic News" featured James Ray Miller in "Carving the Animals of Scandinavia." It was also a book signing party for author Miller's first published book, Whittling Flat-Plane Animals. This

book features 15 Scandinavian animals which can be carved by using only one chip carving knife. "Chip carving has grown in popularity during COVID," Miller said, "because people are looking for something to do." If you ever wanted to earn a SofN Cultural Skills pin in Chip Carving, Miller's book would be a great guide.

Next week, Bill Injerd (Nordkap lodge – Detroit MI) and Kirk Mies (Central lodge – D5) will present "The Sloopers." The Sloopers were the Norwegian-American equivalent of the Pilgrims, who sailed by a sloop (sailing ship) and landed in New York harbor on October 9, 1825. They were the first large group to emigrate from Norway.

Injerd is publisher of the book "The Sloopers: Their Ancestry and Posterity," and Mies is Treasurer of the Slooper Society of America, which consists of descendants of the Sloopers.

#### Summary


