
#### We also have a pretty exciting year-end drive that will be announced in October!

## Lodge Foundation Fundraiser – non-contact version-Karen Eberhardt idea

#### 2 months before event

- Lodge predetermines who (one or more) will be the coordinator for lodge Foundation Fundraiser event. This person(s) would coordinate the list of items for sale; collect tickets from members and the monetary funds; do the drawing of the basket awards; set up collection and distribution of baskets at a pre-determined location and time. The lodge treasurer will mail proceeds to Int'l Foundation.
- Have lodge members email or call with a 'basket or item' commitment to the fundraiser coordinator with the name or theme of their basket/item and the items contained in their basket. This information then can be put on a lodge foundation fundraiser basket email list for the lodge to view and make their selection(s).
  - Those members without an email will need to have a hard copy of the event timeline and the item list mailed to them along with a ticket sheet so they can also participate. (Ticket sheet is a separate attachment.)

#### 1 month before event

- Publish list of baskets/items that are for the Foundation Fundraiser drawing and email/regular mail out item list with individual ticket sheet.
  - Correspondence will need to indicate the last day to mail back the basket selections with payment. Best if the date is 10 days before the drawing selection date so return mail will have time to be delivered to the event coordinator.
  - Indicate on list form how/who the check should be made out to the lodge. You decide if you may or may not receive cash.
- Send the Word document/pdf 'Ticket Sheet' to be filled out by lodge members and mailed back to coordinator with their monetary contribution. Payment will be based on how many tickets the member fills out on their sheet.
- Ticket will indicate to print lodge member Name; Telephone number; and Basket # for that ticket's selection. Individual tickets will be \$1 a ticket.
- Send completed ticket sheet(s) to the event coordinator(s) with payment or can have members bring or drop-off their tickets and money to a modified lodge meeting event or contact person.

#### Event Date – Tracking of tickets

- For all the mail-in tickets the coordinator(s) would be cutting apart the tickets (so not to lose any single tickets) and putting them into individual envelopes for each basket drawing at the meeting/drawing date.
  - Doing this ahead of time would help keep all the tickets in the correct group for drawing.
  - Coordinator would need to take the basket envelope contents out for the bowl/container drawing when it's each basket's turn.
  - A list of member's # of tickets with the amount paid will help with record keeping. Optional tracking would be the basket selection #s per member.

#### Event Date – either lodge drawing or modified lodge meeting

- Using the pre-determined list of basket and item donations. Go through the list by individually selecting a ticket winner and writing it on a Lodge Winner List next to the basket or item number.
- If doing this by non-meeting drawing, email/mail the Basket/Item Winner list to lodge members. Use this list for the basket/item pick-up day/time.
- Basket distribution Have a pre-determined Drop Off and Pick-up Date and Time (will need person(s) watching or supervising the baskets.
  - $\circ$  Suggest having a drop-off 30 60 minutes before the pick-up time OR at the same time.
  - Can use a building or parking lot with trunk distribution
  - Can have basket/item makers deliver them to the lodge member who won the item. This may be a little tricky if participants live a distance apart.

Reaching Out to Our Members

Spread Some Joy (even from a distance)

Let your members know that their membership is valued.

Your lodge newsletter reaches your members, but what is truly *felt* is usually something more personal.

Ask your local Board to set-up a call list to reach all of your members at one time or another. Lodge presidents could organize a phone tree so everyone is included.

Consider implementing any of the following ideas to reach your membership.

Cover a member's sidewalk with happy message and doodles made with chalk. If children live there, leave a bucket of chalk behind!

- 1. Cut out hearts from colors of paper and make a rainbow in your window. Those that were made earlier this year may need refreshing.
- 2. Paint rocks with bright colors and write a hopeful thought; deliver to a member in need of uplifting.
- 3. Assemble a gift basket for an elderly member. Your lodge president may have a list of older members who would appreciate this surprise.
- 4. If you have a lodge member who is an essential worker, prepare a special basket for them. Include candles, a good book, chocolates, gum, or their favorite snack.
- 5. Surprise a member who lives far away and send them an old-fashioned piece of snail mail!
- 6. Arrange for a balloon or candy bouquet to be delivered to a member of your choosing. Think of those members who keep your lodge ticking.
- 7. Text a cute animal picture to someone who needs a picker-upper; write a short personal message. Ask them to Zoom or meet virtually in another format.
- 8. Start a Norwegian or Nordic puzzle swap.
- 9. Leave a basket of sweets or drinks for lodge members who live in assisted living communities.
- 10. Plan a drive-by event for Leif Erikson Day-October 9.
- 11. Help with a member's fall lawn or garden clean-up, leave some Norwegian flags behind.
- 12. Purchase inexpensive food coupon and send it to a member who would appreciate a special surprise (Culver's, A&W, Mc Donald's, Chick Fil-A, Wendy's, Burger King).
- 13. Remember your youth members with a small token of your appreciation for their help with your events, i.e. a plate or krumkake, rosettes, or Norwegian sugar cookies. A pizza coupon would bring a smile.

We will weather the pandemic together: wash your hands, wear a mask, and keep your hand sanitizer at close reach. Like many of you, I look forward to resuming lodge activities in 2021.
