The auction is coming! The auction is coming!

Our annual lodge auction will take place during our OCTOBER meeting. Please start thinking about what you could contribute to help raise funds for both the Sons of Norway Foundation AND our lodge.





In a medium saucepan, combine the berries, sugar, lemon juice and salt.

Place the pan over medium heat and bring to a gentle simmer.

Reduce the heat to medium low and cook, stirring often, until the berries break down and the jam thickens slightly, about 10-15 minutes.

It will continue to thicken as it cools.

Remove from heat and stir in vanilla extract.

Let cool and transfer to a clean glass jar. Cover and refrigerate.

Use within 2 to 3 weeks. Can also freeze small portions for longer storage.

Swedish Queen's Jam (Drottningsylt)

Recipe from the True North Kitchen:

In honor of this month's Swedish program, enjoy this tasty treat!

You can use fresh or frozen berries with this receipe.

Ingredients:

- 1 cup blueberries
- 1 cup raspberries
- 3/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1 Tbsp lemon juice
- Pinch of salt
- 1 tsp vanilla extract

That's a lot of (cinnamon) buns!

Apparently, the average Swede eats cakes and pastry equivalent to 316 cinnamon buns per year! This cinnamon-spiced doughy delight is essentially a long string of pastry dough wrapped into a ball and stuck together with sticky-sweet cinnamon buttery syrup. In Sweden, 'fika' is an essential part of everyday life. In fact, it's so sacred that two coffee breaks per day are an unwritten rule in many Swedish workplaces. And, while newcomers to Sweden are often sceptical about fika at first, many end up admitting that some of the best ideas are hatched on fika breaks.

Nothing says fika more than a cup of coffee and a cinnamon bun. The cinnamon roll or bun (or 'kanelbulle' in Swedish) was first created after the First World War, but, as the ingredients (flour, sugar, egg, butter, cinnamon and cardamom) were expensive and hard to find, it did not become popular until the 1950s. These days, it's the ultimate symbol of Swedish home cooking and, as any Swede will tell you, the smell of newly baked cinnamon buns is the best in the world.

The cinnamon bun is so popular that, in 1999, a collective of Swedish baking ingredient producers known as Sweden's Home Baking Council announced that October 4th would henceforth be Cinnamon Bun Day ('Kanelbullens dag').



Scandiana lodge Viking statue dedication poem from Jim Nelson

Jim was inspired by the Fornyrðislag (a specific Old Norse poetic meter) when he wrote the 1985 dedication for the launching ceremony of a viking boat replica in Canada. He's updated his original work for the dedication of Thor, our Norway Garden Viking: (note: words in parentheses are for reference, not part of the poem's meter)

Willing work-force toils tirelessly, fashions fighter, silent sentry.
Labors end, image stands, mighty warrior mute minder.

Battle-wager (warrior) brandishes battle-staff (spear),
Stalwart spear-man holds helmet-bane (sword),
guarding ground midst myriad foliage,
brave as bear fierce as falcon.
Willing warrior stands stolid,

boldly bearing battle-cloud (shield).
Clutches mighty helmet-harmer (sword),
frightens foes from Friendship flora.
Workers honored, hosts cheering
Join now in festive feast!

This sounds different than a Shakespeare Sonnet... and here's why. Fornyrðislag (a specific Old Norse poetic meter) features:

1) Alliteration: Pairing words that begin with the same sound:

"Better burden bears no one on joyful journey than words of wisdom." (Adapted from the Hávámál, the Old Norse book of proverbs.)

2) Emphasis on first syllables of words in each line: rhyming consonant or vowel sounds, or both:

"Howling hound is hushed in distance";

"constant craving";

"He's the speeding spark of light".

3) Rich use of kennings (metaphors for key words):

sea-strider = ship;
battle-cloud = shield;
warrior-bearer = horse;
helmet-harmer = sword

3) Minimal wordage, employing only the most meaningful words from phrases:

Willing warrior stands stolid, Clutches Helmet-harmer, boldly bearing battle-cloud. Frightens foes from Friendship flora.

The inspiration for our 2025 dedication poem came from Jim's earlier work: Stabelavløpning (launching) for «Ormen stutte», Camrose, Alberta – 22. mars 1985

Western winds blow briskly, bear sea-strider shielded from storm, home to harbour; graceful lines glisten brightly. Hark, all hear on day of delight: let eager host blow briskly, from storm, home to harbour; glisten brightly. on day of delight: bid tired traveller

share his store in water-walker's honour;

warmest welcome is now offered!

Hele Kongefamilien Skal til Stavanger Publisert: 25.6.2025

Fra før har det vært kjent at Deres Majesteter Kong Harald og Dronning Sonja kommer til Stavanger første fredagen i juli. I dag ble det klart at de også får selskap av H.K.H. Kronprins Haakon, H.K.H. Kronprinsesse Mette-Marit, H.K.H. Prinsesse Ingrid Alexandra og Prins Sverre Magnus.

Dermed blir det storslått feiring av Dronning Sonjas 88-årsdag, og markering av både 900-årsjubileet og utvandrerjubileet 4. juli.

Det er første gang i historien at både kongeparet, kronprinsparet, en prinsesse og en prins er i Stavanger samtidig.

- Det er en stor ære - og en historisk begivenhet for byen vår - at tre generasjoner kongelige kommer til Stavanger. Det er ekstra hyggelig at det skjer på Hennes Majestet Dronningens bursdag! Jeg håper så mange som mulig tar turen til sentrum fredag 4. juli, både for å ønske de kongelige velkommen og for å vinke farvel til Restauration, sier ordfører Tormod Losnedal.

I år markerer vi nemlig ikke bare byens, domkirkens og bispedømmets 900 år – det er også 200 år siden den første organiserte utvandringen fra Norge til Amerika. 4. juli kl. 13.15 skal en replika av emigrantskuta Restauration seile ut fra Vågen og starte sin ferd over Atlanteren for å gjenskape seilasen fra 1825. I forkant blir det festmarkeringer både i domkirken og på torget – med storfint besøk!

Tre generasjoner kongelige kommer for å delta i 900-årsjubileet og utvandrermarkeringen denne dagen, og hele regionen er invitert til torget og Vågen før Restauration legger ut på sin ferd til New York!

The entire Royal Family is going to Stavanger (Published: June 25, 2025)

It has already been announced that Their Majesties King Harald and Queen Sonja will come to Stavanger on the first Friday in July. Today it was announced that they will also be joined by HRH Crown Prince Haakon, HRH Crown Princess Mette-Marit, HRH Princess Ingrid Alexandra and Prince Sverre Magnus.

This will be a grand celebration of Queen Sonja's 88th birthday, and a commemoration of both the 900th anniversary and the emigration anniversary on July 4th.

This is the first time in history that the King and Queen, the Crown Prince and Queen, a princess and a prince are in Stavanger at the same time.

"It is a great honor – and a historic event for our city – that three generations of royalty will come to Stavanger. It is especially nice that it happens on Her Majesty the Queen's birthday! I hope as many people as possible will make the trip to the city center on Friday, July 4th, both to welcome the royals and to wave goodbye to Restauration," says Mayor Tormod Losnedal.

"This year, we are not only marking the 900th anniversary of the city, the cathedral and the diocese – it is also 200 years since the first organized emigration from Norway to America. July 4th at At 1:15 p.m., a replica of the emigrant ship Restauration will set sail from Vågen and begin its journey across the Atlantic to recreate the voyage from 1825. In advance, there will be celebrations both in the cathedral and on the square – with great attendance!"

"Three generations of royalty will come to participate in the 900th anniversary and the emigrant commemoration on this day, and the entire region is invited to the square and Vågen before Restauration sets off on its journey to New York!"
