
Sunday, Sept. 14, 2025, 2 p.m. at Trinity Lutheran Church "Giants in the Earth" presentation by Gail Thompson-Hadley

In October this year, Norwegian-Americans will commemorate the 1825 first organized journey of Norwegian emigrants to America 200 years ago.

On April 27, 2025, Gail journeyed to Sioux Falls, South Dakota, for a revival by the South Dakota Symphony Orchestra of the Pulitzer-winning 1951 opera based on Ole Rolvaag's epic 1927 novel of Norwegian-American pioneers, "Giants in the Earth." Rolvaag based his story on what he learned about his wife's grandparents' lives from a time just a few dozen years after those Restauration emigrants had arrived in America.

The robust symphony music, vibrant singing, historical costumes, and an entrancing video stage background brought Rolvaag's story to life.

Please join us on Sunday, September 14th, when Gail will share her reactions to the opera as well as what she learned about Ole Rolvaag from 3 of his grandchildren who rode the bus with the group for 4 hours each way from Minneapolis to Sioux Falls and back!

In celebration of her legacy, a selection of her sacred music, newly arranged for oboe d'amore and piano, was premiered at a salon concert hosted by the Ladies' Library Association of Kalamazoo in honor of International Women's Day in March. Though her musical journey reached audiences far beyond, Selden made Kalamazoo her home in her later years, where her artistry and influence continues to inspire.
