2019 Financial Statements of the Sons of Norway

The 2019 Financial Statements of the Sons of Norway were published in the June 2020 issue of the Viking, as part of the 2019 Annual Report. This issue had the “Candy Crush” cover story.

For the fiscal year ending December 31, 2019, the Sons of Norway had a net loss in its operations.

The Balance Sheet showed assets of \$350 Million as of December 2019. For the 12 months of operations ending December 31, 2019, the revenue was \$30 Million with a net loss of \$3 Million.

In 2017, the Sons of Norway had a net loss.

Obviously, a net loss is not good for any organization. Despite the net loss, CEO Christopher Pinkerton was optimistic for the future, citing the increase in the number of insurance agents hired in 2019, increasing from 83 to 473, an incredible increase.

All members of the Sons of Norway, including Askeladden Lodge, must be mindful that we are a fraternal benefit society, with both a business (insurance) element and a social element. Members should be aware of the financial products available, such as the life insurance and the annuities; and, if able, consider purchasing one of the products.

The 2019 Annual Report did not include a membership report, however, based on the most recent figures that I have seen, the Sons of Norway has about 50,000 members and about 360 local lodges.


WWII German Ships and Outboard Motors

As the Covid-19 pandemic continues, I don't expect our Sons of Norway lodge to meet in person anytime soon, but we can be thankful for alternate means of communication from simple telephone calls to our print and email newsletter to Sonja Henie's upcoming Zoom program we have been invited to join September 13th at 2 p.m.


My family time this summer was spent Norwegian-style in the outdoors. Our three children and their families live too far from SW Michigan to stop by for an afternoon backyard BBQ but they did manage a safe visit home for a week in July from Wisconsin, Ohio, and Pennsylvania by renting RV's to camp out in my driveway. We ate our meals on the front deck, the six young grandchildren had fun playing together outside and swimming at Warren Dunes, and we all remained free from the virus.

I found two Norwegian books to read this summer during my abundant home alone time. *Occupied* by Kurt Blorstad is based on the author's journals his father kept as a young boy in Norway from 1936 to 1945. Young Trygve Blorstad spends most of the German occupation of Norway with his 2 brothers, sister, mother and grandmother, Bestemor. His grandfather, Bestefar, had died young of last century's pandemic, the Spanish flu.

The author provides vivid descriptions of their daily life in rural Norway with the strong family connections, hard work, hardships, and very real dangers from the Nazi soldiers. When one of the local coast watchers disappears, young Trygve is secretly recruited as a replacement. He uses a telescope hidden high on the mountainside to observe German boats, ships, and even a submarine which he reports to a local underground contact. At age 70 on a return trip to Norway, he finally reveals his wartime secret work to his son, the book's author. Find more information at Kurtblorstad.com.



Those of us who grew up on Michigan lakes take outboard motors for granted but it was Norwegian immigrant, Ole Evinrude, who imagined how much faster he could travel in a boat with a motor powering it rather than his arms on oars. The 67-page biography, *Ole Evinrude and His Outboard Motor*, reports that 5-year-old Ole spent most of his time crossing the Atlantic from Oslo in 1882 in the ship's engine room. On their Wisconsin farm, Ole was more interested in tinkering with tools than farming. He learned about math, engineering, and mechanics from magazines, and built his first boat at age 15. The story, true or maybe not, is that he was motivated to build his first boat motor to get 2½ miles across the lake with ice cream before it melted for his future wife and business partner, Bess. Ole apprenticed as a machinist and went on to design and manufacture boat motors. His business was initially boosted by contracts for Scandinavian fishing boats. He continued to innovate with lighter weight aluminum motors and was a major entrepreneur.
