Queen of the Norwegian-American Settlements


Please make plans to join us for our next virtual event. Together we will watch a 40-minute documentary film which explores the history of the earliest Norwegian pioneers who arrived on the prairie in 1839. The film focuses on these early pioneers, their life

and living conditions for the first decade. The emphasis is on the growth of prairie architecture to the introduction of the Norwegian Lutheran religion, the introduction of commerce, growth of local villages and towns, and the vestiges of Norwegian culture that exist yet today.

This documentary was used as a class resource for week 5 of the Sons of Norway District 5 virtual history course offered earlier this year. The Koshkonong Prairie Historical Society, located in Cambridge, Wisconsin, is dedicated to preserving and sharing the history of the people, churches, businesses, schools and other places on the Koshkonong Prairie.

Following the movie, Askeladden members will stay on line for a brief business meeting. Three main orders of business are to approve the 2022 budget emailed to members

The Sons of Norway 2020 Financial Report

For most of us, the Sons of Norway is a social organization, connected with Norwegian culture. Legally, according to the Charter, the Sons of Norway is a "fraternal benefit society," in short, a life insurance company.

As a business, in 2020 the Sons of Norway operated with a net loss just as it did in 2017 and 2019. In three out of the last four years, the Sons of Norway has operated at a net loss. The financial statements, published in the June 2021 issue of the *Viking*, show the following:

- 1. As of December 31, 2020, the Sons of Norway had assets of \$338 Million.
- 2. For the 12 months ending December 31, 2020, the Sons of Norway had income of \$34.6 Million and a net loss of \$3.6 Million.

Despite the unprofitable operations in recent years, CEO Christopher Pinkerton remains confident in the current business plan and in the future, citing the following:

- 1. In 2020, the number of insurance agents increased from 473 to 2,294; an increase of 385%.
- 2. In 2020, the income from the sale of insurance premiums increased from \$14.3 Million to \$19.4 Million, an increase of 35%.

As a lodge, members need to take the following actions: First, become knowledgeable about the Sons of Norway financial products.

Second, invite the Sons of Norway Insurance Agent to a monthly lodge meeting, at least once a year.

Third, if feasible, purchase a Sons of Norway life insurance policy or an annuity policy.
