Askeladden Lodge invites our members and friends, and those of Sonja Henie, Sognefjord, and Vasa Satellite Lodges, to celebrate Norway's Constitution Day with us. Hipp, Hipp, Hurra!

Barnetog: We will begin with the traditional barnetog, or children's parade, so if you have local family or friends with children, we encourage you to join us for a parade around the church grounds, weather permitting.

Food with Friends: Following the parade, we will proceed with a meal and social time when we can enjoy visiting with friends. The Askeladden Lodge will

be celebrating 210 years of Norway's constitution with our annual 17 Mai event. Norwegians consume more than 13 million pølser (hot dogs) on this single day. That's about 2 1/2 hot dogs per person. We are sad at the passing of our dear Askeladden friend, Jean Darling. We will miss her cheerful presence when we gather for Syttende Mai but we can celebrate the joy she brought to our lives. Please join Askeladden members and friends as we celebrate Norway's Constitution Day on May 19th.

A quick search online led me to *North Wild Kitchen's* 17 suggestions for celebrating Syttende Mai like they do in Norway which you might do at home yourselves on May 17th. Follow links below for video of the Oslo barnetog, a glorious multi-singer rendition of the national anthem, and more.

Excerpted from 17 Ways to Celebrate Norway's Constitution Day (17 May) at Home - North Wild Kitchen

- 1. Wake up bright and early and get the celebrations going with a salute. If you don't have a cannon, you can bang pots and pans!
- 2. Fly your Norwegian flag(s) and decorate with red, white and blue. Make food with strawberries, raspberries and blueberries.
- 3. **Dress your best.** Wear your bunad if you have one, even at home on the 17th.
- Pull out the linens and china. Decorate your table with flags, ribbons and flowers.
- Prepare a full breakfast spread. Your breakfast buffet might include scrambled eggs, smoked salmon, fresh bread, cheeses and cold cuts with bubbly for a toast.
- 6. **Have your own in-home parade and/or watch earlier ones.** Here's a 12+ minute video of Oslo's parade from 2019.
- 7. **Shout "Hipp Hipp Hurra!"** It's the official chant of the day.
- 8. **Listen to the drums.** Play your own drums if you have them.
- 9. **Congratulate your friends and family.** "Gratulerer med dagen" is the greeting of the day. Happy Birthday!
- 10. Indulge in ice cream. Lots of ice cream!
- 11. Eat pølser "hot dogs".
- 12. Bake a cake or two or three... May is the month for cakes!
- 13. Fill your afternoon full of games. Make it a fun day for kids.
- 14. **Sing along.** At 12:00 p.m. (GMT +2) on 17 May, 2021, all of Norway sang the **national anthem** (4 ½ minute video) and people were encouraged to open windows and sing along.
- 15. Watch the *Hans Majestet Kongens 3. Gardekkompani (HMKG)* perform. They are a renowned military band and drill unit of the Norwegian Armed Forces who participate in parades, ceremonies and international military tattoos. See them perform here in a 14 minute video.
- 16. **BBO for dinner.**
- 17. **Kos deg.** After a long, fun-filled day, get cozy and relax with family and friends.

You might also enjoy watching a Norwegian NRK TV 90-minute video of Syttende Mai 2023 celebrations around the country from children's marches and sack races to views of the royal family and tables laden with red, white and blue fancy cakes and other tasty Norwegian treats.

New Krone Design Revealed

Norway's 20 krone coin has gotten a new look! To commemorate the 750 years since King Magnus VI proclaimed the third nationwide legal code in 1274, a call went out for design submissions.

The winner of that competition was Michael Guilfoyle, an already established coin designer who runs his own coin and metal trade business in Wales. The 60-year-old Welshman was tipped off by a Norwegian friend about the contest and made his submission despite some stiff competition from Norwegian competitors.

Guilfoyle's design for the krone ultimately won out because of the way it linked the Middle Ages to the present and symbolizes the "legislation's significance for the country." The coin features an image of King Magnus on horseback, carrying the scales of justice

and a shield, to represent the Law of the Land, or landsloven.

The new coin was revealed at the museum of Cultural History in Oslo, with Michael and his wife in attendance. It went into circulation February 1 of this year.

Delayed Russ Partying Proposed

In Norway, high-school students have a unique tradition in the weeks leading up to graduation. The tradition is known as russefeiring and it is essentially a month-long party with costumes, cultural events, pranks, and music. Following the celebration, students sit for their exams. It is said to be rite of passage for Norwegian youth.

Typically, the celebration leads up to May 17 and ends with participation in the Syttende Mai parade. However, there have been recent talks by the Norwegian

also wants to ban russ party buses in some places.

Youth proponents of russ would rather see exams move earlier instead of moving russ, so as not to conflict with summer holidays and students getting ready for the next step of their education. No changes have been made yet; it will likely take a year or more. However, there are steps being taken to elect a russ government that can be a voice in the negotiations.
