Sons of Norway Foundation Month

Curtis Cleveland, Foundation Director The month of October is the Sons of Norway Foundation Month. Most of the lodges in the International Sons of Norway, including ours, will have presentations about the Foundation at their lodge meetings. Some lodges, including ours, will ask members to make a donation to the Sons of Norway Foundation.

The Sons of Norway Foundation, founded in 1966, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation, is the charitable arm of the International Sons of Norway. Every year the Foundation awards 25 scholarships to members and the children/grandchildren of members. In 2022, the value of the scholarships awarded was \$133,000.

In addition to the scholarships, the Foundation awards grants to individuals, lodges, and community groups to further Norwegian culture and humanitarian issues. In 2022, the Foundation awarded over \$75,000 in grants.

At our October meeting, as the Foundation Director for the lodge, I will give a short presentation on the Foundation, with emphasis on the Foundation scholarships. I will ask members to consider giving individual donations to the Foundation, which are tax deductible.

Norwegian Language Class

All of us recommitted to being more serious in our language study this year. We are hoping that everyone will come to our next class prepared to share something brief that they've written (e.g., a short conversation using what we've learned) or something that they've read for practice (e.g., a recipe or a page from a children's book). Through preparing and sharing, we will improve our language abilities together.

The Lodge honored Joyce Hare's 34 years of distinguished service with special recognition.

Those familiar with our lodge's early days told entertaining stories about significant lodge events. Richard Adams told how it came to be that his wife Louise was the first person to sign up for our lodge – even though he was the Norwegian half of the couple. He spoke of the gift

Viking Ships and Dragon Heads!

Viking ships are a prime component of our ancient Norwegian culture. The Gokstad Viking ship was discovered in 1880 in Norway and has its own museum in Oslo which is currently closed for renovations. The Gokstad is believed to have been a fast, flexible ship which could be either sailed or rowed with 16 oar holes in each side for a total crew of 34. It was likely used for both raids and trade and remains Norway's most famous Viking ship. The location name of its burial mound is Gokstadhaugen / Konghaugen which means "King's Mound." https://www.lifeinnorway.net/gokstad-ship/

The afternoon before our Norsk Wood Works tour group visited the Sagastad Viking Centre with the Myklebust ship,

we met with one of Norway's top woodcarvers, Rolf Taraldset. He described for us how he began with drawings, a plaster mold, and then increasingly large carvings as his steps in carving the dragon head and tail for the Myklebust Viking ship. It was awesome to meet the artistic woodcarver and then see his completed work on the Viking ship.

My sister and I visited the Gokstad in the summer of 1970 and could view it from the walkways surrounding it.

The Oseberg Viking Ship from 820 A.D., was discovered in 1904 and reconstructed from more than 2,000 pieces. When a model of the original ship was given a test sail, the model unfortunately sank. More recent analysis of the original ship indicates some differences in design that would have made the



reconstructed model seaworthy like the original Viking ship. https://www.vikingeskibsmuseet.dk/en/professions/ boatyard/building-projects/the-oseberg-ship/

The mid-ninth century Myklebust Viking Ship was discovered under a mound in 1874 but the ship had been burned as a burial site for King Audbjorn. Besides the remains of the king, excavators found tools, costly items, weapons, dogs, and horses. Also discovered was a large, enameled bronze vessel made in Ireland. The mound covering the charcoal layer indicates the ship was a very long 30 meters in length. Evidence for the construction of the ship is based on the more than 7,000 iron rivets found in the ashes. https://sagastad.no/en/the-history/the-myklebust-ship/

I was fortunate to visit the Myklebust Viking Ship replica which was recently completed in 2019. Funds are still being raised for the construction of the mast and sails, but they have successfully launched the ship in the nearby Nordfjordeid Harbor once per year. With stairs leading up to the ship, we could walk inside its immense length and get a real feel for the ship sailed by Vikings more than one thousand years ago. The Myklebust replica is housed in an immense building with a ceiling made to reflect the ship's interior, and to give the impression of moving sea waves. There are also Viking history displays and a shop where I found several excellent Viking books.
