Dogs Mirror Their Owner's Stress Level

Long-term stress seems to transmit from human to dog.

Stress is contagious.

At least when we talk about acute stress.

It has also been shown that acute stress spreads between the human and its best friend, the dog.

But what about chronic stress? Recently, Swedish researchers investigated this topic.

And the results show that human stress levels probably reveal a lot about the condition of their pooch.

Hair tells about stress

Acute stress is easy to measure, in terms of the levels of the stress hormone cortisol in blood or saliva samples. But if you want to measure stress over a long time period, this is an impractical method. Fortunately, researchers have something better up their sleeve: hair.

Cortisol builds up in hair, and over time, hair gives a chronological overview of cortisol levels in the body. Thus, one can use hair strands from dogs and owners to analyze and compare the level of stress over time.

58 dogs and owners

Researcher Ann-Sofie Sundman and her colleagues recruited 58 pairs of dogs and female owners. Some were solely pets, while others were active in competitions. The dogs also walked with an activity meter for a week.

The owners influenced the dog

The results showed that the stress level of the owner seemed to have a clear impact on the stress level of the dog. On the other hand, the level of activity did not appear to have anything to do with long-term stress.

Hunden speiler eierens stressnivå

Langtidsstress ser ut til å smitte fra menneske til hund.

Stress er smittsomt.

I hvert fall når vi snakker om akutt stress.

Det er også vist at akutt stress smitter mellom mennesket og dets beste venn, hunden.

Men hva med kronisk stress? Nylig undersøkte svenske forskere akkurat det.

Og resultatet viser at menneskets stressnivå trolig har mye å si for tilstanden hos vovsen.

Hår fortalte om stress

Det er lett å måle akutt stress, i form av nivåene av stresshormonet kortisol i blod- eller spyttprøver. Men skal man vite hvordan det står til over lang tid, er dette en upraktisk metode. Heldigvis har forskerne noe bedre i ermet: Hår.

Kortisol bygges nemlig inn i håret, og med tida gir hårstrået en kronologisk oversikt over kortisolnivåene i kroppen. Dermed kan man altså bruke hårstrå fra hunder og eiere for å analysere og sammenligne stressnivået over tid.

58 hunder og eiere

Forsker Ann-Sofie Sundman og kollegaene hennes rekrutterte 58 par av hunder og kvinnelige eiere. Noen var rene kjæledyr, mens andre var aktivt med i konkurranser. Hundene gikk også med aktivitetsmåler i ei uke.

Eierne påvirket hunden

Og resultatene viste altså at stressnivået hos eieren så ut til å ha klar innvirkning på stressnivået hos hunden. Det så derimot ikke ut til at aktivitetsnivået hadde noe å si for langtidsstresset.

Focus on a Fagernes Member – Byron Britten

Byron Britten was born at Whitehall Memorial Hospital, on November 1, 1944, to Arnold V. and Bernice (Knutson) Britten. He had/has two brothers, Vernal (deceased) and Bernard.

He attended three elementary schools - Brookside, Blair; Cataract, Cataract; and Angelo, town of Angelo. He spent one year of high school at Hixton High School and three years at Black River High School graduating there in 1963.

After graduation, he worked at Northern Engraving in Sparta and then was a farm laborer for two years. Then he began his trucking career by hauling cattle for Vernal Ellefson. He later became a grocery hauler for Roberts Wholesale, Eau Claire; Gateway Foods,

La Crosse and Anderson Trucking, St. Cloud, MN.

Byron met Marlys Sveen at the Osseo Town Hall Firemen's Dance. They went together for awhile, broke up, but got back together two years later. They were married November 4, 1967 in Pigeon Falls. They have three sons and one daughter and five grandchildren, three girls and two boys.

Byron and Marlys hobby farmed near Strum for 15 years. Byron served as a trustee on the French Creek Church Council, is the language director for our SON Fagernes Lodge and is also our SON float driver. In 1996, the couple went on a trip to Norway where they met family.

Byron enjoys being a SON member because, "It is rewarding to be amongst others who are interested in their Norwegian heritage and want to share and perpetuate it. It helps me keep up somewhat with the language. And it is challenging to keep people interested by learning new things."

Looking back, Byron said, "I learned to speak Norwegian mostly from my grandparents, Martin and Clara Knutson. We lived with them from when I was four until I was eight. They spoke only Norwegian to me and my brother."

The Sons of Norway Fagernes Lodge 5-616 met at the Blair Lutheran Church. We first gathered at the Rainbow Restaurant for a meal.

We recited the Pledge of Allegiance, and the national anthems were sung.

Minutes of the November and December 2019 meetings were read and approved.

Treasurer's report showed a balance on November 1, 2019 of \$3,006.85; on December 1, 2019 \$2,852.06, and December 31, 2019 of \$2,596.15. The amount of the annuity went from \$3,719.13 in September to \$3,720.79 in December. Report was approved.

The Blair Community Center will not be available for our meetings in February and October. The Blair Lutheran Church will be used for those meetings.

Russell Glomstad told us he has a bunch of 78 records with lots of good music.

LaVonne Wier reported that she will initiate the Adopt-A-School reading program at Arcadia Elementary with grades first through fourth. Due to knee surgery, she will not introduce the program until February 28th. It will run through May 1, 2020

We sang Happy Birthday to Donald Ronning. Roger Instenes won the \$5.00 drawing.

President Todd discussed the polo shirts that several people have signed up to order. They will be ordered later, and others can sign up to buy them.

LaVonne read the thank you's from the area food pantries for our monetary Christmas gifts.

The 2020 District 5 convention will be in Madison June 24-28, 2020. We are allowed 2 delegates, and 2 alternates. Election of the delegates will be at our February meeting. The names of the delegates has to be submitted to District 5 by March 5, 2020. Members do not have to own insurance or other products to be a delegate. They do, however, have to own a Sons of Norway product to go to the International convention. That convention will be in Norway in 2020.

President Fetsch has discussed using the Blair church for meetings with the current Vicar. He indicated that it shouldn't be a problem.

The lodge approved sending \$50.00 to the Barnebirke event in Hayward, rather than making and bringing cookies to the event.

President Fetsch installed the new officers for 2020.

Recipe Pan-Fried Whitefish

Ingredients

For the whitefish - White pepper, Sugar, Salt, 1/2 cup breadcrumbs, Salt to taste for the breading mixture, 5-6 Tbsp. butter

For the dressing

1 tsp. horseradish
1 Tbsp. chopped chives, 1/2 tsp. lemon zest
5 Tbsp. sour cream
2 Tbsp. mayonnaise

For the whitefish

Season the de-boned fillets with the salt and white pepper.

Lightly whisk one egg in a shallow bowl. In a separate bowl, combine the breadcrumbs and salt.

Dip the fillets in the egg and then dredge in the breadcrumb mixture.

In a large frying pan at medium-high heat, add the butter and fry the fillets until they are golden brown.

Drain the extra fat by placing the fillets on a paper towel. This will also keep them crispy. If you wish, serve the fried fillets on top of a decent portion of the potato salad.

The location for our Frokost was discussed. Terry Thompson has set up the Ettrick Town Hall for the event. There was a lot of discussion on whether it should be there or at the Blair Lutheran Church.

There are pros and cons for each location. After a vote, it was decided to hold the event at the Blair Lutheran Church.

A reminder was given that the October 24, 2020 meeting will be at the Blair Lutheran Church. The March 2020 meeting will be at the Blair Community Center. A picture of the members of the lodge was shown. It is speculated that some of the original members came to Blair from the Ole Bull colony in Potter, Pennsylvania.

This is the 125th anniversary year of the Sons of Norway. The question was asked if we want to do a special event sometime. We can do publicity to be shared with the local media. No event was planned at this time.

President Todd said it would be neat to go to the grand opening of the new Sons of Norway headquarters in Minneapolis this year. The date is unknown. There is more information about it in the January 2020 Viking magazine.
